*1962 News from the Whitehorse Star***Kuzma Murder Trial Underway Here**

Twenty-eight witnesses were scheduled to be heard in the murder trial of Nicholas Kuzma in connection with the August 18, 1961 death of Canadian Customs man Roy Wilson. Kuzma was arrested in Haines on the 20th.

Because the charge is one of non-capital murder Mr. Justice John Parker told the jurors he would not confine them during the trial. Kuzma is being defended by Gordon King with Stuart Enderton as crown prosecutor. The trial commenced Tuesday and should end tomorrow.

Wilson's bruised and bloody body was found lying about fifty feet from the Alaska Highway at mile 1207.3 on the west side of the right-of-way by Customs Officer Clayton Skelton. Wilson was wounded 11 times about the neck and chest, his face was gashed and bruised and his upper right forearm was broken.

Dr. W. R. Buchan yesterday told the court Wilson died from a wound in his heart. His jugular vein was punctured and also his windpipe. Shown a jack-handle which RCMP Cpl. Steve Penteliuk of Haines Junction found near the body, Dr. Buchan agreed a tool of that nature could have caused some of the wounds.

Evidence showed that Kuzma and Wilson had been travelling together on the night of August 17. They spent about six hours at the bar of Seaton's Lodge in Alaska at Mile 1235. William Seaton owner of the lodge, testified Wilson had been obnoxious for about two hours of his stay and had used obscene language. At one point Seaton offered to hit Wilson unless he apologized to Mrs. Seaton for a remark made to her. The two men had been at the lodge separately on other occasions but this was their first visit together.

Seaton also described a fight which

took place outside his lodge in the parking area after Wilson and Kuzma had left early in the morning of the 18th. He told the court he had seen Wilson hitting at Kuzma while Kuzma sat in the driver's seat of the car and Wilson stood outside. Then Kuzma got out, knocked Wilson down and placed one knee on him, hitting Wilson several times. After this they drove away together.

RCMP Cpl. James Ballentyne, who is with the identification branch, described the scene where the body was found. He said there were tire marks between the soft shoulder of the road and the beginning of the bush. They crossed the ditch that separated them. The bush was quite dense but appeared to have been trampled upon. Wilson was lying on his back with one arm across his chest. His shirt was open with all but one button missing. He was wearing only one shoe and sock. A black leather shoe was found 30 feet from the body and a sock was found hanging on a nearby bush. A few feet from the body there was an area covered by a "red substance" about one foot in diameter.

Cpl. Ballentyne said there were "scrape" indications on the back of Wilson's trousers.

Cpl. N.P. Schiml of the RCMP lab at Regina testified regarding a jack and jack handle mechanism. He said the jackhandle could have made marks that appeared on the mechanism but he could not positively identify them. The jack mechanism had been found in Kuzma's car.

Miss Marlene Pierce from the police lab said she had identified blood on the jack handle but could not identify the group.

Wilma Lee and Russell Allan, both of whom were at Seaton's on the night in question, testified regarding Wilson's unruly behaviour. Mrs. Lee said Roy

Wilson appeared to be trying to start trouble while Nick Kuzma tried to settle him down.

She saw Kuzma again the next morning at White River Lodge where she was then residing. He appeared to be "more or less in a state of shock."

Traveler Garth Fuller from Iowa recalled seeing a man without a shirt step from a car a few miles North of the Canadian Customs early on the 19th and motion him to stop. Fuller did not stop. Later, as he was leaving the customs office, a man who appeared to be the same person drove up to the office.

Customs Officer Clayton Skelton met Kuzma as Fuller was leaving the border office. Kuzma told him there had been a little trouble at Seaton's. He said Wilson had asked him to speak to Clayton concerning having someone else cover his shift as he would not be back for a day or two.

He claimed Wilson had been making a pass at a girl and the man she was with had become angry. Then, Kuzma told Mr. Skelton, Roy had got mad and refused to return with him.

Later in the day Mr. Skelton drove to Snag where he spoke to Russell Allan. On his return to the customs office at about 6 p.m. he spoke to customs officer Ken Watts and as a result of these conversations, drove along the highway to the vicinity of Mile 1207.3 with a friend, Lilly Ewchuk, looking for car tracks in the ditch. Miss Ewchuk spotted Wilson's body.

Note: Nicholas Kuzma, 37, was sentenced to fourteen years in jail after being found guilty of manslaughter in the death August 18, 1961 of Roy C. Wilson, Canadian Customs official. Mr. Justice John Parker imposed the sentence.

1902 News from the Whitehorse Star

- Has Gone to the Outside -

Ed La Belle, Peter Fournier's Partner, Left Dawson July 22nd

*His Name Appeared in the Printed Passenger Lists -- Fournier
Arraigned and Remanded for Seven Days -- Did Not Plead.*

Dawson, Aug. 30 - It has been ascertained that Ed La Belle, the partner of Peter Fournier, who is now under arrest here suspected of being implicated in the murder of three men near Ogilvie the middle of last June, left for the outside on July 22nd as a first-class passenger on the steamer Columbian and though there hangs over his head a suspicion of having abetted in the commission of two or three murders, he traveled under his real name and made no secrecy of his having departed. His name, with the other passengers, was printed in the local papers at the time, and the list is now on file at the police station and at the White Pass office.

Fournier was arraigned on the 23rd inst. in the police court on the charge of murder in the first degree, in having killed Leon Boutillette. He did not plead, but was remanded for seven days, when he will enter a plea.

It is now stated that the report published that \$400 was found on the person of Fournier, is erroneous, and that he had no money when arrested.

The police have received the photographs of three of the five men who left Whitehorse together on the trip down river. They are Leon Boutillette, Alphonso Constantin and Beaudoin.

The body of the former was found near Indian River, and from a tag on a key chain was the name which led to the identification of the remains. The body contained three gunshot wounds which told that he was

shot from behind, and as he turned to see his assailants was shot twice through the head.

The body of Beaudoin was found with a rope on one arm and one on an ankle with slip knots and loops on the ends, which convince the police that the man was murdered and then weighted with stones which dropped off by the continual jolting over the gravel bottom of the river. His head was crushed and there could be no doubt that he also was murdered.

Alphonso Contantin, not showing up in Dawson, can be set down as being the third victim. He came to this country in '98 and became interested on Last Chance.

Beaudoin was a native of Beauce county, Quebec, and had just graduated from college when he concluded to come to the Klondike probably on the representations of Constantin. He was 23 years of age and a bright young man, with the physique of one who is not satisfied with the humdrum life of the east.

The three left Montreal June 4 and reached Whitehorse June 12. June 16 they started in a small boat in company with two other men, who joined the party at Whitehorse.

The body of Boutillette was found on July 16, and that of Beaudoin on August 1. The remains of a man found near Selkirk so badly decomposed that the body was hardly to be recognized, may be the third man of the latest river mystery.

The Weekly Star, Saturday, August 30, 1902
