1901 News from the Whitehorse Star Now Own the C.D. Co.

E.C. Hawkins, general manager of the W.P.&Y. Route, has received advices from London and Chicago to the effect that a deal for the purchase of the property of the Canadian Development company has been put through, to go into effect April 1st.

The purchase includes ten steamboats, all the terminal facilities at White Horse and Dawson, namely, warehouses, wharves, lighters and other apparatus, besides two extensive and complete shipyards, one at White Horse and the other at Dawson. The ten steamboats include the best on the river, namely, the Columbian,, Victorian, Canadian, Yukoner, Sybil, Bailey, Zealandian, Anglian, Mary F. Graff and the Joseph Clossett.

Four other steamboats, clipperbuilt, are in process of construction, to be ready June 1, and to be melded to this Yukon fleet, namely the Dawson, Ogilvie, Hamlin and McConnell, making a total of 14 boats for the passenger and freight business between White Horse and Dawson.

This practically gives the W.P.&Y. Route the control of all the waterways to the interior as it also controls the Atlin route, having purchased what was formerly the John Irving Navigation Co. operating the steamers Gleaner and Scotia and the Taku-Atlin tramway.

Speaking of the labor involved in putting all this vast amount of machinery into systematic working order for next summer General Manager Hawkins said:

"It means a complete reorganization of the service on lines tending to secure greater efficiency at a minimum of cost, which the consolidation of the two interests under one management will best permit. It will admit of greater dispatch and better results for both freight and passengers.

"Improvements and innovations will be the order all along the line. Tariff sheets are now in course of preparation with a view to putting all the traffic on a strictly weight basis, thus doing away with what is known by all shippers as the weight or measurement ship's option system, which has caused a great del of confusion in the past, as under it the merchant was never in a position to figure in advance on what the cost would be for delivering his goods at nay point in the interior.

"It is also contemplated to substitute oil for wood, which, if found practicable for fuel, will shorten the running time of each steamer from 12 to 20 hours on each voyage. – Daily Alaskan.

Death of the Rail

A distressing accident occurred on the W.P. & Y. Route yesterday at 11:55 a.m. about two miles south of Frazer station. Two passengers on the last up trip of the Dolphin, after reaching Skagway, decided to walk over the mountain and had reached the point above named when they were overtaken by the north bound train running at a speed of 25 miles an hour.

At the place where the accident happened the snow is piled up on each side of the track to a height of five or six feet, with barely room for the passage of the body of the cars.

One of the men was on top of the snow bank, but the other a German named Hauser, about 35 years of age, six feet tall, weight about 180 pounds, light complexion and light mustache, was on the track. The man on the bank heard the roar of the train and called to his companion, who endeavored to scale the wall of snow; but he was too late and was caught by the snow plow,

thrown under the wheels and frightfully mangled before the train could be brought to a stop. As soon as possible the train crew took the man from underneath the wheels and placed him on board the train, but he expired a very few minutes afterward.

On examination it was found that his arms and legs were ground almost to a pulp and that a portion of is skull had been torn away. The body was brought as far as Bennett and there left to await an inquest.

No blame is attached to the employees of the railroad, as at the time of the accident the train had just rounded a sharp curve and the plow was throwing such a quantity of snow that it was impossible to see anything in front.

It is said the deceased was a resident of Chelan Falls, State of Washington, and leaves a wife and four children.

Having enjoyed all the comforts of home and congenial surroundings at the Whitehorse Inn, a good night's sleep and a hearty breakfast at the Inn Cafe, let's spend the morning visiting the stores and business houses in town, become acquainted at first-hand with the townspeople and visit the points of interest, bearing in mind that this article is offered as a substitute for a personally conducted tour of the town.

We first visit the local branch of the Canadian Imperial Bank of Commerce of which Mr. A. E. Hardy is the manager. It was here that Robert Service was employed as a teller and where he wrote his first poems and "Trail of '98", which were to bring him both fame and fortune.

A portion of the premises on Main Street are now used by Mr. W. E. Emery, the mining recorder for this southern section of the Territory. Next door is the Yukon Taxi where, if you care to drop in, you may meet Mr. Clyde Wann who operated the first commercial air service in the Yukon. Next in line traveling Westward, is located the Whitehorse Star which from the same location has been serving the community for the past 47 years.

The Fashion Shoppe is where Mrs. Burke operates a thriving business in serving the needs of the community.

The ball park, between Third and Fourth Avenue, has been the favourite stomping ground for all sports events for many years past. There also stood at one time, the old community hall operated by the North Star Athletic Association; a veritable landmark if ever there was one. Unfortunately, this edifice was destroyed by fire a few year ago, whilst occupied by the U.S. Army for hospital
