Space All Contracted

During the past few days the traffic department of the White Pass & Yukon Route has contracted in advance for all the cold storage space on its rail and steamer lines from Skagway to Dawson for the entire season.

The contracts held amount in the aggregate to 1000 tons of freight. This will be chiefly fruits, fresh eggs, poultry, fresh meats, and vegetables.

This is an entirely new business in Alaska transportation annals. The construction of

three new steamers on the upper Yukon by the White Pass company, equipped with cold storage apparatus, was the last step taken in the matter of arranging or cold storage shipments this year by the traffic department.

The steamers equipped in this manner are the Ogilvie, McConnell and Dawson. Each will have a capacity of 20 tons. Skagway News.

1902 News from the Whitehorse Star

Section Man Suicides

Word was sent down yesterday morning from Cowley, a station about 16 miles south of White Horse on the W.P. & Y. Route, that a section man named Michael Daley had committed suicide while temporarily insane.

Dr. Pare and Constable Kelsey of the N.W.M.P. immediately left for the scene of the tragedy to hold an inquest. From the evidence it appeared that Daley had been acting rather queer for several days and on Monday afternoon had tried to throw himself under the wheels of the passenger train but was prevented by his companions.

Monday night about 7 o'clock, Daley, who was in the section house, complained about the room being too warm and not waiting to put on his hat stepped out through the door. After a time uneasiness was felt at his long absence and a search instituted, but without discovering his whereabouts.

Early the next morning the search was re-

sumed and his body found in a small creek that runs by the water tank.

At the water tank a dam had been built across the creek and during the winter a hole had been cut in the ice about 15 feet above the dam for the purpose of drawing water.

The search party Monday night suspecting Daley might have thrown himself into the water hole, cut through the ice immediately above the dam, and made as thorough a search as was possible, but without result. However, on going to the dam in the morning the body was discovered in the open water, where it had been carried by the current.

Daley was born in Staffordshire, England, and at the time of his death was about 55 years of age. Last winter he worked at the round house at White Horse and had only been at Cowley a short time. He was buried yesterday at Cowley.

Work To Be Resumed

On The Anaconda, Rabbit Foot and White Horse Group Mines For Which Large Sums Have Been Offered and Refused

The excellent returns from Messrs. Graingers & McIntyre's properties has given a fresh impetus to copper mining in the White Horse district, and in the course of the next two or three weeks a force of men will be put to work on the Anaconda mine, which has already had sufficient development done to prove it equally rich as the Copper King.

The group of mines comprising the Anaconda, Rabbit Foot and White Horse, is owned by Messrs. J.P. Whitney, A. P. Benton, Ole Dickson, W.A. Pucket, Charley Ward and O'Neil. Of these the Anaconda is the furthest advanced in development, 135 feet of tunnel having already been run, besides

numerous cross-cuts and several shafts to a depth of 20 feet. Last June \$100,000 was offered and refused for the Anaconda and five weeks ago an offer of \$150,000 for the Anaconda and Rabbit Foot was also declined.

The lode on which these claims are located shows an average width of 75 feet, and assays from picked ore have given values as high as \$258 per ton.

At the Anaconda there are now about 100 tons of ore on the dump, but the owners have decided not to ship any of it at present, and will wait for the erection of a smelter close at hand which has every indication of being an accomplished fact during the coming summer.

Death of the Rail

A distressing accident occurred on the W.P. & Y. Route yesterday at 11:55 a.m. about two miles south of Frazer station. Two passengers on the last up trip of the Dolphin, after reaching Skagway, decided to walk over the mountain and had reached the point above named when they were overtaken by the north bound train running at a speed of 25 miles an hour.

At the place where the accident happened the snow is piled up on each side of the track to a height of five or six feet, with barely room for the passage of the body of the cars.

One of the men was on top of the snow bank, but the other a German named Hauser, about 35 years of age, six feet tall, weight about 180 pounds, light complexion and light mustache, was on the track. The man on the bank heard the roar of the train and called to his companion, who endeavored to scale the wall of snow; but he was too late and was caught by the snow plow,

thrown under the wheels and frightfully mangled before the train could be brought to a stop. As soon as possible the train crew took the man from underneath the wheels and placed him on board the train, but he expired a very few minutes afterward.

On examination it was found that his arms and legs were ground almost to a pulp and that a portion of his skull had been torn away. The body was brought as far as Bennett and there left to await an inquest.

No blame is attached to the employees of the railroad, as at the time of the accident the train had just rounded a sharp curve and the plow was throwing such a quantity of snow that it was impossible to see anything in front.

It is said the deceased was a resident of Chelan Falls, State of Washington, and leaves a wife and four children.
