LIQUOR VOTE SET FOR JUNE 23

All Yukon residents, 19 years and up, will be asked to answer this question on Monday, June 23:

“Are you in favour of lowering the legal age for the consumption of alcoholic beverages from 21 years to 19 years of age?”

Commissioner James Smith announced the date and terms of the plebiscite this morning. It is believed to be the first time in Canada that underage voters will have had an opportunity to express their opinions on a question which directly affected them.

There will be no enumeration of voters, and no voters list compiled for the plebiscite, which will be conducted by Federal Returning Officer Harold J. MacDonald of Whitehorse. Instead, each voter will swear an affidavit that they are of the full age of 19 and they were ordinarily resident in the Yukon Territory on March 20, 1969. This was the date on which Yukon Territorial Council approved the idea of the plebiscite being held.

RIVERBOATS UP IN FLAMES

Hundreds of people stood on the banks of the Yukon River yesterday morning and cried as the riverboats CASCA and WHITEHORSE were engulfed by flames.

The two grand old ladies of the White Pass and Yukon Route fleet caught fire at approximately 10 a.m. and were reduced to two large heaps of ashes less than two hours later. The dry wooden ships burned like tinder, with flames rising more than 100 feet in the air within minutes and giving off an intense heat.

Fire officials still have found no cause of the fire, and say that investigations are continuing. Firemen were still hosing down the red-hot coals late yesterday, and no inspection was expected for at least 24 hours, according to Yukon fire marshal Tom Naim.

Shortly after the fire call went out, police helped three young people off the CASCA. The trio, in their early twenties and from Ontario, had been living on

the boat for a week. They were taken in to custody and questioned by police until late Thursday afternoon before being released. No charges were laid and police, along with fire officials, are seeking another explanation for the fire.

The blaze began on the CASCA, spreading rapidly to the WHITEHORSE, less than 10 feet away, and threatened to engulf a storage shed owned by White Pass as well. Firemen, after overcoming initial difficulties with a lack of water, managed to douse the shed and prevent the fire from going beyond the bounds of the riverboats. The pair of stately old steamboats were two of five left from a fleet that plied the rivers of the Yukon during the first half of this century. The WHITEHORSE, built in 1901, was the acknowledged Queen of that fleet. Ironically, she was built on the very spot that she finally died on yesterday.

The three remaining members of the White

Pass fleet are the KLONGDIKE, situated in town just up the river from the two that burned yesterday; the TUTSHI, settled in Carcross; and the KENO, now a national historic site at Dawson.

Within minutes of the fire alarm, hundreds of people had gathered at the final resting place of the two old sternwheelers. Dozens of old-timers who were here when the boats were actually in operation recalled memories to quiet bystanders.

Roy Minter, an employee of White Pass who had long lobbied for the preservation and restoration of the neglected boats, was at the scene too, looking slouch-shouldered and defeated.

"...I've always thought of Dawson as the center of the Gold Rush" he said sadly, "and of Whitehorse as the center of transportation during those days. These boats were such an integral part of all that. Today they're gone and the Yukon just lost a little of its soul."

1901 News from the Whitehorse Star

A Ghastly Find

Early Saturday morning a report was circulated around town that the body of a man had been found on the riverbank beneath the wharf of the W.P.&Y. Route, and crowds were soon flocking to the scene of the find. A STAR man joined the throng, but on arriving at the place indicated and looking over the edge of the wharf, down several feet to where the body lay, it was impossible to tell with certainty whether the rumor was correct or not, the only thing visible being the half of a boot or shoe sticking out of the sand and what appeared to be part of a pair of corduroy pants, the body being buried completely beneath the sand.

The discovery was made by Dave Quartermarsh and Rob McIntosh, who immediately notified the police, and a guard with two prisoners from the barracks were at once detailed to proceed to the place of the reported discovery and exhume the remains.

A coroner's jury had been impaneled in the meanwhile, the members of which took up their position on a scow close at hand and watched the men at their gruesome task. It was only a short time until all doubts were set at rest and the body removed from its bed of sand and slime and hauled up onto the wharf.

On examination of the body the coroner's jury found a gold ring on the third finger of the left hand on which were the words and figures "White Horse 1900". In the pockets of his trousers was found a considerable sum of money. A receipt for royalty for chopping wood on the Big Salmon, which had been issued to Robert Byers by Corporal Lee, was also found in one of the pockets in the dead man's clothes.

Owing to the decomposed state of the face and head of the deceased it was impossible to recognize it, but at the adjourned inquest in the afternoon Mis Decker, of the Windsor hotel, and

Mr. E.A. Morck of the British Yukon Navigation Co., identified the body as that of Frank Schlag, a German about 50 years old and about six feet in height. Schlag was in partnership last summer with two men named Byers and Dobbeck in the woodchopping business near the Hootalinqua, and about the 15th of last September the three partners came to White Horse and Schlag registered at the Windsor hotel.

After coming to town he indulged freely in liquor and early on the morning of Sept. 21st was put out of the Windsor for creating a disturbance, and nothing more was seen of him until his body was discovered on the river bank.

The coroner's jury which had been adjourned until today at 5 p.m. met and took the testimony of C. Racine and A.C. Muller which closed the evidence. The coroner, Inspector Fitz Horrigan, in his charge summed up the evidence to the jury and explained the laws applicable to the facts in the case in a very concise manner, after which the jury retired and n a short time returned with the following verdict:

"That the said Frank Schlag on the 11th day of May, 1901, was found drowned in the Fifty-Mile River at White Horse, Y.T., and that the said Frank Schlag had no marks of violence upon his person; but how or by what means the said Frank Schlag became drowned no evidence doth appear to the jurors."
