WHITEHORSE GAL NAMED MISS CANADA

SHES EVERYBODYS SWEETHEART NOW

alyce Smith (of Whitehorse) last week was named Miss Canada at the annual pageant held this year in connection with centennial celebrations of London, Ontario. Pride of the Yukon, Queen of the Canadian Rockies, she has now been recognized officially from one coast to the other as

Queen of them all. After leaving Whitehorse and getting lost

between here and her destination in London, Dalyce took the country by storm. Police in Edmonton and Toronto were searching and found Miss Yukon had missed her flight to London. Newspapers, radio and television made note of the search for Miss Yukon, the missing Northerner. Some were said to have feared Dan McGrew's relatives sent her on the wrong plane to London, England. However, Miss Smith's vivacious personality won out in the end, bringing wonderful credit to the Yukon.

officials and Jaycee members and will be entertained at a cocktail party and dance later in the day. The dance, which will be open to all, will be held from 9 to 1 at the Inn Ballroom.

The story of her win was picked up by the news services across Canada and brought a good deal of fame to this territory as well as to the brunette beauty herself. The Purser, Lionel Cowper had been burned over his entire body. As was the medical custom at the time of the accident, he had been wrapped in an oily blanket and given strychnine pills. In Whitehorse, when it became obvious that he was going to die, massive amounts of "opiates' were administered, but relief lasted only minutes.

LIQUOR VOTE SET FOR **JUNE 23**

All Yukon residents, 19 years and up, will be asked to answer this question on Monday, June 23:

"Are you in favour of lowering the legal age for the consumption of alcoholic beverages from 21 years to 19 years of age?"

Commissioner James Smith announced the date and terms of the plebiscite this morning. It is believed to be the first time in Canada that underage voters will have had an opportunity to express their opinions on a question which directly affected them.

There will be no enumeration of voters, and no voters list compiled for the plebiscite, which will be conducted by Federal Returning Officer Harold J. Mac-Donald of Whitehorse. Instead, each voter will swear an affidavit that they are of the full age of 19 and they were ordinarily resident in the Yukon Territory on March 20, 1969. This was the date on which Yukon Territorial Council approved the idea of the plebiscite being held.
