

"Martha beats them all" a STAR headline proclaimed in 1963 when an Old Crow skier and mother of five children became the first Yukoner to win a national skiing title.

Twenty-five year old Martha Benjamin won the senior women's cross country skiing title at the Canadian championships in Midland, Ontario. Her time over the 10 kilometre race was 43.29 minutes. And in 1989, 26 years after that historic event, Benjamin was inducted in the Yukon Sports Hall of Fame. "After all these years, I didn't expect to receive something like this," she said. "I just had it in me that I wanted to do it, and I did it," she said of her win in Midland Ontario.

Benjamin and Ben Charlie were the only two skiers to attend the championships. Charlie ranked 11th in a field of 48. His toughest competition came from a group of Finns from Sudbury who swept the field.

Both skiers brought high credit and distinction (not to mention the publicity) to their community and to the Yukon as a whole. Star correspondent Edith Josie wrote before they left: "I had wire from Mr. Harry at Whitehorse. He said Ben Charlie and Mrs. Martha Benjamin will go to Ottawa for International Olympic Competition for skiers on February 13. Frank Cook will take them out. Everyone is very glad to hear these two will go out long travel. Hope they had good trip. Old Crow is little town and Father Mouchet is training boys and girls for the skiers. Now they even go way out to Ottawa. Sure big surprise for the people in Old Crow

Mouchet, an experienced ski instructor for the French army, designed a training program which is now called TEST (Territorial Experimental Ski Training). This program strives to stimulate and motivate children to discover themselves, develop self-reliance through a rigorous training schedule and gain self-confidence through a series of tough, but surmountable challenges.

Telephone Service

The next public improvement to be knowledge of this being conveyed to the one inaugurated in White Horse will be a telephone system. Already the wires have been strung, the switch boards placed in working order and the receiving instruments will be installed next week. The work now being done is of a private nature, but when completed will in all probability be absorbed and become a part of the Yukon Electrical company.

The system being put in is what is known the Strowger Automatic Telephone, one of the latest and most up-to-date known, by the use of which absolute secrecy is guaranteed to every patron of the line. Each telephone has an automatic sliding dial by turning so that the figures on the dial correspond to a plate beneath. The sender can be automatically connected with any other instrument on the circuit which he may desire. Should the line be in use, connection cannot be made, a

wishing to use the same by a slight buzzing sound.

The Strowger Automatic telephone does away with a receiver at the central office. While a message is being sent the central office is disconnected the same as other phones on the circuit, and there is no danger whatever of any communication which you wish to make being conveyed to disinterested narties

The Strowger Automatic telephone is rapidly replacing companies in the east where central telephone operators are employed, and there is now being formed in Chicago a company with \$5,000,000 capital to put in the system in that city.

The rules for the telephone will at the commencement be \$10 per month for business houses and \$5 per month for residences.

The light planes were brought down late Saturday afternoon by blinding snow that swept the Alaska Highway area north and south of Whitehorse.

A Cessna aircraft piloted by Lloyd Ryder of Whitehorse piled into the trees about 200 yards from the highway at mile 927.

Seriously injured in the crash was Art Christenson, who is with the territorial engineer's department here. He suffered a fractured skull and a badly broken arm.

Also in the plane were Mrs. Christenson and Mrs. Ryder. They escaped with a severe shaking up and bruises as did also Mr. Rvder.

The second downed plane also a Cessna, was flown by Lloyd Romfo of Yukon Flying Services With him was Game Director I B Fitzgerald. They hit a "whiteout" over Teslin Lake which brought visibility down to the zero point.

The plane had just taken off from Teslin where a third passenger was dropped. Having left the airstrip, they were over the lake when the blinding snow hit. The plane smacked into the snow-covered ice of the lake, tearing off the undercarriage and skidding for a long distance along the surface.

Owner Romfo said the plane is salvageable. He was knocked briefly unconscious in

the crash and suffered a severe gash on his head. Mr. Fitzgerald escaped with "sprains and bruises". About three-quarters of a mile from the shoreline, both men were able to snowshoe to the highway. The Ryder party had been planning to at-

tend a fly-in at Northway, just over the Alaskan border. They set off in company with a plane flown by Bob Campbell, another piloted by Jack Chapman and a third plane, blown by a U.S. resident.

Over Burwash landing the weather looked bad ahead and so they decided to turn back. The Campbell and Chapman planes landed at 1016 to wait out the weather but the Ryder aircraft headed on to town. Meanwhile the U.S. aircraft continued on successfully to Northway

Mr. Ryder said the weather was clear to Takhini Hot Springs. A forecast received indicated one thousand feet at Whitehorse. He flew down the Takhini river to the Yukon but there the storm had moved in and he "couldn't see a thing". Turning to come back he lost direction in the snow and came down in the trees of a hillside. Mr. Christenson's condition is satisfactory.
