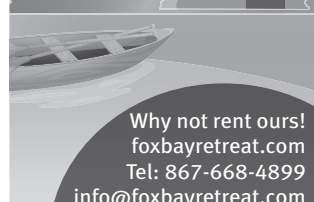

WRECKAGE of the COLUMBIAN – The charred hull, which was a menace to navigation, was floated downstream a short way and abandoned in “Columbia” slough.

Of all the accidents that can befall a person on a boat surely an explosion and fire is one of the worst. Three tons of black powder exploded on the Columbian’s forward deck that fateful September day and the resulting fireball was carried the length of the ship by a downstream wind. Everyone in the immediate vicinity of the explosion would die, except for passenger Ernest Winstanley. He would be saved by his long underwear.

The Purser, Lionel Cowper had been burned over his entire body. As was the medical custom at the time of the accident, he had been wrapped in an oily blanket and given strychnine pills. In Whitehorse, when it became obvious that he was going to die, massive amounts of “opiates” were administered, but relief lasted only minutes.

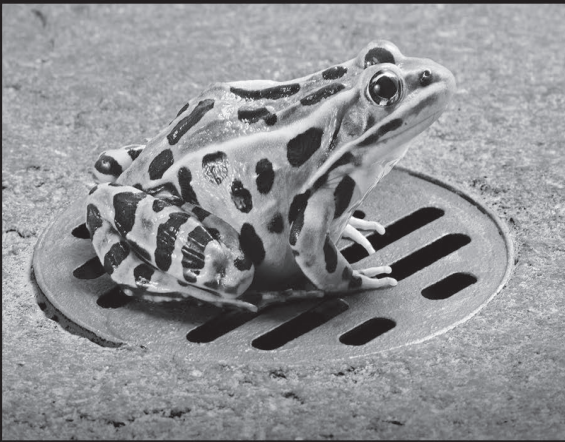

PERCY DE WOLFE: IRON MAN OF THE NORTH

Dawson News, April 28, 1919: Percy De Wolfe, the lower Yukon River mail carrier, of the Dawson-Eagle route, broke through the ice while traveling the river Saturday and had a thrilling experience in which he barely escaped losing his life.

Two fine horses, valued at \$600, which he was driving, went through the ice at the same time, and were lost in the river.

The accident occurred near the Halfway House, between Dawson and Fortymile. De Wolfe's home is at the Halfway House. When a mile below the place he was jogging along easily, and started to turn from the track he was following to a winter trail. He had gone but a little way from his old course when there was a crash of the ice, and the horses went through. He was near the bank of the river, and away from the swift water.

The sleigh remained on the edge of the unbroken ice, with a single tree hanging over. De Wolfe attempted to get the head of the horses above the ice, but the first he knew he was in the water in the midst of the animals. The horses, immediately on going through the ice, began pawing desperately, and were encumbered by their harness. Percy, in his effort to get out, was grazed down the back by the foot of one of the horses, and his overalls torn open near the waist. Had a hoof struck him he would have been forced down, and no doubt would have passed under the animal and then under the ice.

Fortunately he came up close to the overhanging single tree. He was plunging up and down in the water, in the grim attempt to save himself. It was almost impossible to get hold of the edge of the ice and crawl out, but he reached for the single tree. Two grasps were made with no avail. The third time was the charm. He got a good grip on the object and gradually lifted himself from the chilly waters.

By the time Percy had rescued himself the horses had disappeared. Although soaked to the skin from head to foot, he removed the mail to the shore, and left it in a safe position. He then proceeded to his home a mile above the scene of the accident. The sleigh was recovered later.

De Wolfe got here yesterday with a dog team and the mail. The horses which he lost were uninsured. He states it will be necessary to get another team to carry on his mail business next season. De Wolfe has traveled the Yukon between Dawson and Eagle as mail carrier for years, never daunted by cold, bad ice, storm or other adversities. Several times before this he has fallen through the ice, and has lost horses and sleighs, but despite the great perils he has encountered, he seems to bear a charmed life, and has emerged unscathed each time. Winter after winter he has forged through the most severe of arctic temperatures, and always has made his destination on time. The moderate sum he receives as compensation for carrying on this dangerous route is a pittance compared to that received on some other routes where the risks comparatively are nil. His losses in this experience wipes out the profits of months of hard labor.

IRON MAN – Percy De Wolfe continued on the job until 1950 and he died a year later. During his 40 year career he developed a reputation for stamina and dependability that was never tarnished no matter how cold or precarious the weather. In his honour the Percy De Wolfe Memorial Mail Run was organized by the Klondike Visitors Association in 1977, this proved so popular that it graduated to being a full blown race in 1981 and is now one of the qualifying events for the famous Iditarod.

**WIDOW ESCAPES AS FIRE GUTS ARLINGTON**

A chance visit by Jim Toohey on his way from his home at Sulphur to Dawson probably saved the life of Mrs. Harry McDonnell Wednesday night when the Arlington Roadhouse burned to the ground. The Arlington is a Dawson landmark 10 miles from town, famous for years for its hospitality.

Toohey had dropped in to see the pioneer widow shortly before she noticed sparks dropping into the living room from the stovepipe safety. The pair rushed upstairs to find the top floor ablaze. Flames shot fiercely through the tinder dry building so quickly Mrs. McDonnell had time only to grab a few dresses and blankets. The fire truck and many volunteers sped to the scene through sixty-below weather from Bear Creek but the old-time roadhouse burned to the ground.

The McDonnell's were Gold Rush pioneers and the Arlington known to hundreds of Yukoners, was built during the Gold Rush days.

MAKING A DELIVERY – Percy De Wolfe ca. 1930 with horse drawn sleigh De Wolfe became known as the "Iron Man of the North" due to the 1919 adventure and other exploits during his mail carrying career. De Wolfe, a Nova Scotian by birth, arrived in the territory during the Gold Rush of '98, and began his career as mail carrier in 1910. Depending on the season, mail and freight was carried by dog or horse drawn sleigh, or boat and the 340 kilometre round trip journey between Eagle, Alaska and Dawson City, Yukon took 8 days.

NEW FLAG FLIES

Canada's new flag is flying over Whitehorse tonight, following a simple 10-minute ceremony outside the RCMP barracks at noon which was watched by a few hundred spectators.

Snow was falling as the Union Jack came down and the scarlet-and-white ensign was hoisted in its place. RCMP Staff-Sgt. W.A. Coombs headed the flag party. Commissioner Gordon Cameron and numerous local dignitaries were among the listeners as the Rev. Harold Marston, president of the Whitehorse Ministerial Association, and Bishop Coudert both spoke briefly in a dedication ceremony.

About 150 local school-children took time off to attend the event. It was all over in 10 minutes, and the crowd dispersed quietly, leaving the new flag fluttering in a drizzle of snowflakes.

Only two people stood and watched as another flag was raised simultaneously outside the federal building. Earlier this morning, it also flew over the Whitehorse General Hospital.

What's going to happen to all those old Union Jacks? No official word on their fate was available this afternoon.

BOBBY KENNEDY CLIMBS MT. KENNEDY

Mountain and mountain climbing stories in The STAR have always received prominent coverage. One of the interesting climbs was made by the late U.S. Senator Robert Kennedy in March 1965 when he climbed the Canadian mountain named for his brother President John F. Kennedy.

The mountain, 145 miles north-west of Whitehorse, forms a triangle with Mount Alverstone and Mount Hubbard and until that time was the highest (13,905 ft.) unclimbed peak in the St. Elias mountains.

When the mountain was named for the late President, the National Geographic Society and the Boston Museum of Science decided to conduct a joint survey which would result in a completely detailed map. Bobby Kennedy, though he had never climbed before, joined the party at the last minute and thus the world press became very interested. Newsmen descended on the Yukon in droves but the Whitehorse Star had the first published pictures of the event.

Veteran Everest climber Jim Whitaker of Seattle led the three man party of Kennedy and Barry Prather up the last ridge where they unroped and let the Senator ascend the last 50 yards alone to be the first man on top. It was not a particularly tough climb, as climbs go, but it was a personal pilgrimage for Kennedy, who planted the Kennedy family crest, Canadian flags and National Geographic emblem on the top.

Kennedy Mountain, at the lower camps, was crawling with other members of the climb, military men and helicopters, private planes rented by the media, the ice field research people and anyone else who could scrounge a ride.

A National Film Board crew guided by Whitehorse mountaineer Monty Alford, recorded the climb and Yukoners Bob Erlam, Alex Van Bibber and Wayne MacDonald took pictures which appeared in Life, Time and The Whitehorse Star. The latter three, incidentally, were also present when Kennedy came down that night from the ascent. They fed him steak, instant mashed potatoes, ice cream and the heel of a bottle of Madeira wine which someone (probably Bob) had stashed in a pack sack.

Back in Whitehorse, Kennedy dropped in to the Capital Hotel to get cleaned up and have a drink with the locals. He bought a round and paid for it with a cheque which owner Cal Miller kept and had framed. Said Cal, "I told him I wanted to keep it as a souvenir of the next President of the United States."
