

Winterizing Your Pet

When the temperature (and the snow) begins to fall, you'll find that your pet needs a little extra care from you. Here are some points to remember this winter.

Cats and dogs need protection from wet and cold, whether they get it inside your house or inside their own. Cats are best kept inside when it gets cold, as are most small and short-haired dogs. An outdoor dog needs a dry, elevated dog house with clean, dry bedding and a flap over the opening to keep drafts out. Or consider adding a dog door to the garage with a soft cushion in the warmest corner.

when it's below freezing, and break the ice or refill with water as necessary.

Outdoor dogs need more calories in the winter to produce body heat, so increase the amount you feed your pet. On the other hand, indoor dogs and cats may get less exercise in the cold months, and will need fewer calories to avoid weight gain.

Chemicals used to melt snow on sidewalks can irritate pets' paws, so you may need to wipe them with a wet cloth after an outing. Dogs outside in the snow may need the ice between their pads removed.

Antifreeze tastes good to pets, but it is a deadly poison. The most likely source of the poison is radiator drainage spots in your garage, which should be flushed with



A cat may crawl up under your car seeking shelter and warmth near Humane the engine. It may get caught in the fan and seriously injured when the engine starts. Open the hood of your car or slap it noisily with your hand before starting the engine on cold days to startle any animal sleeping there.

THE WHITE DEATH

f all the natural phenomena peculiar to the Rocky mountain region none is more strange, or terrible than the mysterious storm known to the Indians as "the white death". Scientific men have never yet had an opportunity of investigating it, because it comes at the most unexpected times and may keep away from a certain locality for years. Well-read men who have been through it say that it is really a frozen fog. But where the fog comes from is more than anyone can say. This phenomenon occurs most frequently in the northern part of Colorado, in Wyoming, and occasionally in Montana.

About two years ago a party of three women and two men were crossing North Park in a wagon in the month of February. The air was bitterly cold, but dry as a bone and motionless. The sun shone with almost startling brilliancy. As the five people drove along over the crisp snow they did not experience the least cold, but really felt most comfortable, and rather enjoyed the trip. Mountain peaks fifty miles away could be seen as distinctly as the pine trees beside the roadside.

Suddenly one of the women put her hand up to her face and remarked that something had stung her. Then other members of the party did the same thing, although not a sign of an insect could be seen. All marveled greatly at this. A moment later they noticed that the distant mountains were disappearing behind a cloud of mist. Mist in Colorado in February? Surely there must be some mistake. But there was no mistake, because within ten minutes a gentle wind began to blow and the air became filled with fine particles of something that scintillated like diamond dust in the sunshine. Still the people drove on until they came to a cabin where a man signaled them to stop. With his head tied up in a bundle of mufflers, he rushed out and handed the driver a piece of paper on which was written: Come into the house quick, or this storm will kill all of you. Don't talk outside here."

Of course no time was lost in getting under cover and putting the horses in the stable. But they were a little too late, for in less than an hour the whole party was sick with violent coughs and fever. Before the next morning one of the women died with all the symptoms of pneumonia. The others were violently ill of it, but managed to pull through after long sickness. - Aisle's Magazine



TWO PLANES DOWN SATURDAY

Both Crashes Near Highway

The light planes were brought down late Saturday afternoon by blinding snow that swept the Alaska Highway area north and south of Whitehorse.

A Cessna aircraft piloted by Lloyd Ryder of Whitehorse piled into the trees about 200 yards from the highway at mile 927.

Seriously injured in the crash was Art Christenson, who is with the territorial engineer's department here. He suffered a fractured skull and a badly broken arm.

Also in the plane were Mrs. Christenson and Mrs. Ryder. They escaped with a severe shaking up and bruises as did also Mr. Ryder.

The second downed plane also a Cessna, was flown by Lloyd Romfo of Yukon Flying Services. With him was Game Director J.B. Fitzgerald. They hit a "whiteout" over Teslin Lake which brought visibility down to the zero point.

The plane had just taken off from Teslin where a third passenger was dropped. Having left the airstrip, they were over the lake when the blinding snow hit. The plane smacked into the snow-covered ice of the lake, tearing off the undercarriage and skidding for a long distance along the surface.

Owner Romfo said the plane is salvageable. He was knocked briefly unconscious in the crash and suffered a severe gash on his head. Mr. Fitzgerald escaped with "sprains and bruises". About three-quarters of a mile from the shoreline, both men were able to snowshoe to the highway.

The Ryder party had been planning to attend a fly-in at Northway, just over the Alaskan border. They set off in company with a plane flown by Bob Campbell, another piloted by Jack Chapman and a third plane, blown by a U.S. resident.

Over Burwash landing the weather looked bad ahead and so they decided to turn back. The Campbell and Chapman planes landed at 1016 to wait out the weather but the Ryder aircraft headed on to town. Meanwhile the U.S. aircraft continued on successfully to Northway.

Mr. Ryder said the weather was clear to Takhini Hot Springs. A forecast received indicated one thousand feet at Whitehorse. He flew down the Takhini river to the Yukon but there the storm had moved in and he "couldn't see a thing". Turning to come back he lost direction in the snow and came down in the trees of a hillside.

Mr. Christenson's condition is satisfactory.

Wolves Attack Horses

Wolves, within a few miles of Whitehorse, caused the death of one horse and severely injured a second during the weekend. The two animals belonging to Douglas Lowe of 609 Alexander were pursued and bitten about the hindguarters at the northwest end of Marsh Lake.

Mr. Lowe found the wounded animals still on their feet but one was so badly injured he had to shoot it. The horses were part of the plans to use next season as a big game guide and outfitter.

He said he did not know how many wolves were involved but found many tracks in the vicinity adding that, "even one wolf can make plenty of tracks."

Whitehorse West Councillor Bert Boyd gave the okay to Game Director J.B. Fitzgerald to put poison bait out on the ice in an effort to stop the mauraders. This approval is necessary within 75 miles of settled areas under the recentlyamended game ordinance. Outside this radius the game director has full authority with regard to poison bait.

Today Mr. Fitzgerald commented his department was carrying out a poison program within the limits of its financial

Game outfitters and guides see this year as a bad one for game in the Yukon bush. With the snow building a firm crust on which the wolves can travel but the game cannot, moose, caribou, elk and deer are easy prey for the carnivores.

Reports from the Peel River area indicate that the pickings are so good for wolves they are killing caribou and leaving them which is a virtually unheard of occurrence.

Wolves over the NWT border were said to be preying on herds with ease this year. One report told of a thousand animal herd literally hemmed in by wolves in the Nahanni country.
