CITY RESIDENT MAKES POLAR HISTORY

hitehorse resident Martyn Williams has become the first Canadian to reach both poles of the earth using only skiis and a small dog team. Williams, 44 and his three companions on the International north Pole Expedition were picked up Saturday after six grueling weeks of fighting severe temperatures, driving winds, and

tough, unpredictable sea ice. All four members of the group are South Pole veterans. Australian Mike McDowell 44, accompanied Williams to the South Pole in 1990. Norwegian brothers Sjur, 27, and Simen Modre, 29, traveled to the South Pole in 1991.

The group is now resting at the advance base on Ellesmere Island before they return tonight to Resolute Bay, N.W.T.

Tough terrain slowed progress for the first few weeks. However, the expedition traveled more than 25 kilometres a day in the last couple of weeks to make up for last time.

They had to reach the pole by May 12. After that date, warming temperatures cause fog and broken ice, which makes air pick-up impossible.

The trip has been much tougher than expected, Pangman said. Temperatures have averaged about -35° and driving winds have caused frostbite. A team of eight dogs has been more of a hindrance than a help. Pangman said.

DAWSON CRIMINAL RE-CAPTURED AFTER A YEAR'S HUNT

SWAN HARRISON, AN INSANE PATIENT ARRESTED IN THE NORTHWEST TERRITORIES

/wan Harrison, who escaped from the Northwest Mounted police at Selkirk on the Yukon a year ago, has just been captured by members of the same efficient force at a point thousands of miles distant. Harrison has been taken a prisoner in the Northwest territories.

A telegram has been received by Major Wood at Dawson telling him of the capture of Harrison.

When Harrison escaped at Selkirk he was being taken out of the Yukon to New Westminister, B.C. as an insane patient. He had been arrested and convicted at Dawson some time before for stealing, had become insane while in prison and was transferred to the lunatic ward.

While the steamer was lying at Selkirk Harrison made a leap from the boat, and landing partly in the water walked ashore, scrambled away up the bank and ran into the woods before he could be overtaken. He and a number of other lunatics were in charge of Corpl. Stewart on the trip up the river. A short search was made for Harrison, but he could not be found, and the boat proceeded with the remainder of the party.

From traces obtained it is believed he went down the Yukon river and escaped by way of St. Michael or Nome. He is said to be from the States, but how it is that he should wander over into the Northwest Territories is scarcely understood. It was thought at first from the point at which the fellow turned up he must have taken a chance at the famous Edmonton trail and gotten through, but the idea is scarcely credited.

ship by a downstream wind. Everyone in the immediate vicinity of the explosion would die, except for passenger Ernest Winstanley. He would be saved by his long underwear.

The Purser, Lionel Cowper had been burned over his entire body. As was the medical custom at the time of the accident, he had been wrapped in an oily blanket and given strychnine pills. In Whitehorse, when it became obvious that he was going to die, massive amounts of "opiates were administered, but relief lasted only minutes.
