Dawson, Dec. 28 - Mat Tomerlin, who was held over on his preliminary hearing a few weeks ago on a charge of being one of the men that held up the Dominion gambling house here, on the 15th of last November, has made a full confession of his guilt, implicating William Brophy as the "short man," and his partner in the crime.

Immediately after the hold-up Brophy, who was suspicioned as being one of the robbers, was arrested and brought before the court, but on his preliminary examination the evidence was of such slight nature that he was dismissed.

Finding that Brophy could not be held on the charge of robbery another of vagrancy was entered against him, but this also failed, and about three weeks ago he was discharged from custody. He is now supposed to be con-
