Yukon big game outfitter Alex Van Bibber of Champagne, Yukon, took the territory's first albino moose on October 3, 1968, in the Blanchard River area of southern Yukon, just north of the BC. border and east of Mile 94 of the Haines Road.



Van Bibber first spotted the cow moose while on a hunt, guiding William Portman of Oklahoma City on September 30. Later he and a group of hunters from Whitehorse; John Gatey, Jr., Francis Chambers, Francis Fromme and Alex's wife, Sue Van Bibber, returned to the area and bagged the albino during the Yukon's open cow moose season, along with two other cows and a light colored bull with a horn spread of sixty-three inches.

Of all the accidents that can befall a person on a boat surely an explosion and fire is one of the worst. Three tons of black powder exploded on the Columbian's forward deck that fateful September day and the resulting fireball was carried the length of the ship by a downstream wind. Everyone in the immediate vicinity of the explosion would die, except for passenger Ernest Winstanley. He would be saved by his long underwear.

The Purser, Lionel Cowper had been burned over his entire body. As was the medical custom at the time of the accident, he had been wrapped in an oily blanket and given strychnine pills. In Whitehorse, when it became obvious that he was going to die, massive amounts of "opiates" were administered, but relief lasted only minutes.

NOTICE OF JUDICIAL VACANCY

The Judicial Appointments Advisory Committee ("The Committee") advises the Commissioner in Executive Council of the Northwest Territories on the appointment of judges to the Territorial Court and invites applications for a judicial position in the Northwest Territories.

This appointment, while primarily a criminal law position, will also involve civil claims, judicial dispute resolution, family law, child protection, Youth Justice Court, Justice of the Peace education, as well as traveling (mostly by plane) throughout the Northwest Territories.

1901 News from the Whitehorse Star

Now Own the C.D. Co.

E.C. Hawkins, general manager of the W.P.&Y. Route, has received advices from London and Chicago to the effect that a deal for the purchase of the property of the Canadian Development company has been put through, to go into effect April 1st.

The purchase includes ten steamboats, all the terminal facilities at White Horse and Dawson, namely, warehouses, wharves, lighters and other apparatus, besides two extensive and complete shipyards, one at White Horse and the other at Dawson. The ten steamboats include the best on the river, namely, the Columbian,, Victorian, Canadian, Yukoner, Sybil, Bailey, Zealandian, Anglian, Mary F. Graff and the Joseph Clossett.

Four other steamboats, clipperbuilt, are in process of construction, to be ready June 1, and to be melded to this

Yukon fleet, namely the Dawson, Ogilvie, Hamlin and McConnell, making a total of 14 boats for the passenger and freight business between White Horse and Dawson.

This practically gives the W.P.&Y. Route the control of all the waterways to the interior as it also controls the Atlin route, having purchased what was formerly the John Irving Navigation Co. operating the steamers Gleaner and Scotia and the Taku-Atlin tramway.

Speaking of the labor involved in putting all this vast amount of machinery into systematic working order for next summer General Manager Hawkins said:


"It means a complete reorganization of the service on lines tending to secure greater efficiency at a minimum of cost, which the consolidation of the two interests under one management will best

permit. It will admit of greater dispatch and better results for both freight and passengers.

"Improvements and innovations will be the order all along the line. Tariff sheets are now in course of preparation with a view to putting all the traffic on a strictly weight basis, thus doing away with what is known by all shippers as the weight or measurement ship's option system, which has caused a great del of confusion in the past, as under it the merchant was never in a position to figure in advance on what the cost would be for delivering his goods at nay point in the interior.

"It is also contemplated to substitute oil for wood, which, if found practicable for fuel, will shorten the running time of each steamer from 12 to 20 hours on each voyage. — Daily Alaskan.

MARTHA BENJAMIN - 1963

MARTHA BENJAMIN: CANADIAN CHAMP

"Martha beats them all" a STAR headline proclaimed in 1963 when an Old Crow skier and mother of five children became the first Yukoner to win a national skiing title.

Twenty-five year old Martha Benjamin won the senior women's cross country skiing title at the Canadian championships in Midland, Ontario. Her time over the 10 kilometre race was 43.29 minutes. And in 1989, 26 years after that historic event, Benjamin was inducted in the Yukon Sports Hall of Fame. "After all these years, I didn't expect to receive something like this," she said. "I just had it in me that I wanted to do it, and I did it," she said of her win in Midland Ontario.

Benjamin and Ben Charlie were the only two skiers to attend the championships. Charlie ranked 11th in a field of 48. His toughest competition came from a group of Finns from Sudbury who swept the field.

Both skiers brought high credit and distinction (not to mention the publicity) to their community and to the Yukon as a whole. Star correspondent Edith Josie wrote before they left: "I had wire from Mr. Harry at Whitehorse. He said Ben Charlie and Mrs. Martha Benjamin will go to Ottawa for International Olympic Competition for skiers on February 13. Frank Cook will take them out. Everyone is very glad to hear these two will go out long travel. Hope they had good trip. Old Crow is little town and Father Mouchet is training boys and girls for the skiers. Now they even go way out to Ottawa. Sure big surprise for the people in Old Crow."

Mouchet, an experienced ski instructor for the French army, designed a training program which is now called TEST (Territorial Experimental Ski Training). This program strives to stimulate and motivate children to discover themselves, develop self-reliance through a rigorous training schedule and gain self-confidence through a series of tough, but surmountable challenges.
