**NEW FLAG FLIES**

Canada's new flag is flying over Whitehorse tonight, following a simple 10-minute ceremony outside the RCMP barracks at noon which was watched by a few hundred spectators.

Snow was falling as the Union Jack came down and the scarlet-and-white ensign was hoisted in its place. RCMP Staff-Sgt. W.A. Coombs headed the flag party. Commissioner Gordon Cameron and numerous local dignitaries were among the listeners as the Rev. Harold Marston, president of the Whitehorse Ministerial Association, and Bishop Coudert both spoke briefly in a dedication ceremony.

About 150 local school-children took time off to attend the event. It was all over in 10 minutes, and the crowd dispersed quietly, leaving the new flag fluttering in a drizzle of snowflakes.

Only two people stood and watched as another flag was raised simultaneously outside the federal building. Earlier this morning, it also flew over the Whitehorse General Hospital.

What's going to happen to all those old Union Jacks? No official word on their fate was available this afternoon.

FIRST AIRCRAFT**Whitehorse Paved the Way for Aviation in the North.**

For a history of aviation in the Yukon Territory we have to go back to June, 1920, when Capt. H.T. Douglas of the U.S. Air Force and Capt. H.A. Leroyer of the Canadian Air Board arrived in Whitehorse to talk over a proposed international aeroplane flight from Mineola, N.Y. to Nome Alaska. They both came with the authority of their respective governments to make all necessary arrangements for landing places, fuel, supplies, etc. In commenting on the proposed flight the Whitehorse STAR of that day described it as "an event that will go down in history as one of the most daring conceptions of the potentialities of aerial flight that has ever been conceived since the possibilities of a lighter-than-air craft as a means of transportation became, through the inventive genius of man, a certainty."

INDOOR BASEBALL - ITS ALL THE RAGE

The details are sketchy but here’s what we know so far...

The inaugural game was played on Saturday, November 24, 1906 between the “B.Y.N.” and “Police A” teams. The win went to “Police A” with the score board showing 20-13.

While the STAR dutifully announced each up-coming game and faithfully published all results; we never did state the actual rules. From reading through the write-ups we know they played in a “large hall” at the North Star Athletic Association. Somehow, the walls of the hall were incorporated as part of the “field”. As we see in the picture here, they used a narrow baton-like bat and a rather large ball. The public was always “cordially invited” and there were “seats for ladies in the balcony.”

The sport was so popular, games were scheduled each Monday, Wednesday and Saturday evening. (And in 1906 that schedule included games played on Christmas Eve and Boxing Day too - now that’s dedication!)

SMELTING CENTRE

Construction of the three big hydro plants in the vicinity of Kluane Chilkoot Pass and Teslin. Estimated out - 500,000,000 horsepower - makes this the largest integrated power yield in the world.

In conjunction with the hydro construction, plans call for erection of smelters and leaching plants to process ores from Frobisher holdings in the Yukon, Northwest Territories, Ontario, Quebec, Greece and southern Rhodesia. Frobisher also has properties under development in Uganda, West Africa, Venezuela, Peru, Labrador, Montana, North and South Dakota.

Details of the plan - official permission for preliminary surveys has already been given - came to light recently and followed by a month rejection of a United States bid to harness the Yukon River system, of which Lac Laberge is a part.

At that time Resource Minister Winters intimated that development of Canadian resources in the area should be left to Canadian enterprise - Frobisher is owned by the gigantic Canadian industrial empire, Ventures Corporation.

THE SIX WHO VANISHED

“Air Aces of three nations comb polar wastes for a trace of missing aviators”

FAIRBANKS, Alaska, August 18 -Top ranking aviators of three nations were poised today on the rim of the Arctic for an intensive search of the polar wastes in quest of the vanished Soviet pilots, Sigismund Levanevsky and his five companions, awaiting better weather at Fairbanks.

From the Whitehorse STAR August 20 ,1937
