COLD WEATHER TAKEN IN STRIDE
BY OLDTIMERS IN EARLY DAYS

Bouts of cold weather seem to bring out lots of tall tales but in reality the people who live through extreme temperatures just sort of tough it out. Longtime Yukon resident Emil Forrest recalls the winter of 1908 when it was 72 below in Dawson City.

He kept on attending school and even delivered papers on the coldest day. His brother had the route for the old "Klondike Nugget." Emil remembers but for some reason he got the job that time. After he finished his route he just went home, like any other day.

White Pass railroader George Barry recalls one winter he froze his face 15 times before he could grow a beard for protection.

One of the coldest years in the Yukon was 1917. At Christmas that season it was 75 below in Whitehorse. According to a report written at the time, the fog that day was so thick a person could almost separate a chunk of it with a circular motion of the hand. W.D. MacBride was here then and he remembers if a cup of water was thrown high in the air, it would come down with a rattle.

It was even colder that year in Dawson, but Yukon-born Johnny Hoggan tells a story of going out on a hike with another youngster and getting almost halfway to Fort Macpherson before turning back. They were 28 days out on the trail.

The coldest trip he ever made came many years later for Johnny, when he travelled from Dawson to Mayo in 1954. He started out December 9 at 40 below. As it turned out, that was the warmest temperature the whole trip. Driving a small cat, which had no cabin, Johnny got to Mayo to find it 67 below.

On boxing day it "warmed up" to 58 below so he left with a companion to head for the junction, 34 miles away. It was -72 there and on the next lap of their journey to Clear Creek, the mercury stayed at 72 below all the way. When he finally got home to Dawson January 5, 40 below seemed like summer time.

While he was away that month, Mrs. Hoggan remembers she burned four cords of wood to keep a small cabin warm.

In spite of all his experiences in cold winters, Johnny says he still isn't used to the cold.

KILLERS

Peter Fournier under arrest

DAWSON - Yesterday Peter Fournier, who was known to have left Whitehorse on June 16th in a small boat with Leon Bouthillette and Guy Joseph Beaudoin, whose bullet pierced bodies were found about a month ago in the Yukon river near Ogilvie, was arrested here. Four hundred dollars in Quebec bank notes were found on his person. The police are hot on the trail of a man named LaBelle, Fournier's partner, and who is also known to have been one of the party when it left Whitehorse. A man from Whitehorse has identified Fournier as being one of the party of five leaving Whitehorse for Dawson on June 16th inst. Ed LaBelle, the partner of Peter Fournier, says that Fournier killed the men and threw their bodies into the river while he was absent from camp on a hunting expedition.

WIDOW ESCAPES AS FIRE GUTS ARLINGTON

A chance visit by Jim Toohey on his way from his home at Sulphur to Dawson probably saved the life of Mrs. Harry McDonnell Wednesday night when the Arlington Roadhouse burned to the ground. The Arlington is a Dawson landmark 10 miles from town, famous for years for its hospitality.

Toohey had dropped in to see the pioneer widow shortly before she noticed sparks dropping into the living room from the stovepipe safety. The pair rushed upstairs to find the top floor ablaze. Flames shot fiercely through the tinder dry building so quickly Mrs. McDonnell had time only to grab a few dresses and blankets. The fire truck and many volunteers sped to the scene through sixty-below weather from Bear Creek but the old-time roadhouse burned to the ground.

The McDonnell's were Gold Rush pioneers and the Arlington known to hundreds of Yukoners, was built during the Gold Rush days.

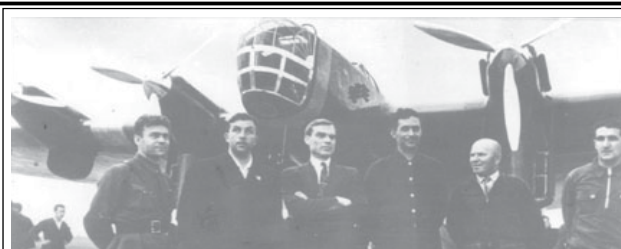

A CONSIGNMENT OF HOCKEY JUNK

It's not often a local hockey team has a chance to vie for the Stanley Cup, but it happened one time in Yukon history and the results of the contest make it probable that it will never happen again.

Hockey was big in the Klondike in 1904, and the competition so fierce that local promoters of the sport were looking for bigger and greater challenges. With the typical Yukon "if you're going to go for it, you might as well go for the top" attitude, Dawson organizers wrote to Ottawa challenging the World Champions to a Stanley Cup duel. The challenge was accepted.

The Klondike team sallied forth from Dawson to do battle with the Ottawa Invincibles, also known as "The Silver Seven."

DAWSONITES LIBERATED BY U.S. FORCES IN THE PHILIPINES

Provost Marshal-General Leech wired from Washington, D.C. on February 21 to Mr. and Mrs. Murdoch McCuish in Dawson, Y. T. informing them that their son John and his wife Virginia, had been released by the U.S. Forces from the Japanese internment camp at Santo Tomas, Luzon Island in the Philipines.

Mr. and Mrs. John McCuish were on Mindanao Island when the Japanese captured the Philipines and managed to evade capture for about two years by hiding in the hills before they were forced to surrender.
