1969 News From the Whitehorse Star

Court Told:

'Blood Gushed Like Water' Murder Suspect Committed For Trial

Zoltan Macko was committed for trial Friday, at the conclusion of a preliminary hearing into a charge of non capital murder. The 30 year old miner from Hungary has been charged in connection with the shooting death of Mehmed Dupobac, also 30, at Arctic Gold and Silver Mine near Carcross on December 10 last year.

During the two day hearing the court heard a large number of crown witnesses, miners, tell that an all night drinking party had been going on in room eight of the bunkhouse, occupied by Jordan Kalajdjiev and Frank Kuster. The two roommates were present, as were Dupobac and others. Later the group was joined by the accused Macko, known to his acquaintances as "Zorro".

Witness testified that some time before six a.m. there was an argument and a scuffle between Kalajdjiev, known as "Blackie" and Macko, who eventually left and returned to his own room down the hall.

Shortly afterwards he was seen outside Kalajdjiev's room and two shots were heard.

The court learned that in the corridor Zorro allegedly was calling Blackie to come outside, and accused him of kicking him (Zorro) in the face during the fight.

Kalajdjiev, a dark-haired 26 year old Yugoslav, testified that he tried to keep

the door shut but that Mehmed Dupobac known as "Mayo" went out in the hall to act as peacemaker.

Witnesses said that a discussion followed, a third shot was fired, and Dupobac fell to the floor with a shotgun blast in his chest.

Walter Parsons of room six next door told how he overheard both the fight in the room and the shooting. He said that during the party he heard Zorro's voice say "help, help, don't do that." And someone else in room eight say "Don't Jordan, that's enough." There was mostly talk, and then later three shots.

LIKE A GUSH OF WATER

"After the third shot I heard a sound like a gush of water," said Parsons, "and blood came under the door of my room and up the sides of the closet."

Other testimony revealed how the First Aid man, William Evans was summoned but could do nothing for the deceased. Evans said he took a gun away from Zorro.

The preliminary hearing was conducted before Magistrate John Varcoe, with D.S. Collins appearing for the crown and H.H. Regehr for the defence. It was not immediately known when the case would go to trial.

TORNADO HITS WATSON LAKE

What has been described as being a phenomena in this part of Canada occurred on Wednesday, September 9 between two and 3:00 p.m. when a tornado formed over Watson lake, raced down the far shore opposite the airport and up the bank to dissipate somewhere in the bush by the tank farm. The tornado was accompanied by a short but extremely heavy hail storm with some of the stones measuring three-quarters of an inch in diameter.

Pete Koszuk, the only known eye-witness to the forming of the tornado said the water began to swirl and gradually lift off the surface.

Evidence of its violence can be seen on the path it took when it struck the lake shore. Poplar, jack pine and spruce trees varying in height 30 to 70 feet and four to 10 inches in diameter were uprooted and piled together like matches. Fortunately the tornado struck only the lake and the trees.

T. informing them that their son John and his wife Virginia, had been released by the U.S. Forces from the Japanese internment camp at Santo Tomas, Luzon Island in the Philippines.

Mr. and Mrs. John McCuish were on Mindanao Island when the Japanese captured the Philippines and managed to evade capture for about two years by hiding in the hills before they were forced to surrender.

YOUNGSTER FIVE DAYS IN BUSH

Five days lost in the bush last week didn't bother a resourceful 12 year-old Upper Liard youngster. Although he suffered frostbitten toes, he says, "I wasn't scared. I've been hunting since I was a little kid."

Young Andy Lutz is in Whitehorse General Hospital receiving treatment for two frozen toes that are the only ill effects he suffered after spending five days lost in the bush near Upper Liard.

In freezing weather, without blankets or food and without a fire after the first day, Andy showed presence of mind rare even in adults. After making a bed of spruce boughs, he got his two dogs to sleep each side of him for warmth... he shot a squirrel and ate it raw.

Twelve year-old Andy said in hospital here, "Last Sunday I went hunting for rabbits and I thought I was coming back that afternoon. I went about five miles, saw a rabbit and chased it and then I didn't know which direction to go. I wasn't in that area before. It got dark and I didn't know what to do so I camped. I looked for my matches and I only had a couple in a box. I always have two boxes but couldn't find the other. I got a fire going and camped there the night."

"Next day I heard a truck going and tried to find the highway. I made a big circle and came right back where I was. The day after it was the same. I went the other way and came right back. Then I got smart with myself. Thursday I backtracked and that's when they found me. I had just got to a lake."

WIDOW ESCAPES AS FIRE GUTS ARLINGTON

A chance visit by Jim Toohey on his way from his home at Sulphur to Dawson probably saved the life of Mrs. Harry McDonnell Wednesday night when the Arlington Roadhouse burned to the ground. The Arlington is a Dawson landmark 10 miles from town, famous for years for its hospitality.

Toohey had dropped in to see the pioneer widow shortly before she noticed sparks dropping into the living room from the stovepipe safety. The pair rushed upstairs to find the top floor ablaze. Flames shot fiercely through the tinder dry building so quickly Mrs. McDonnell had time only to grab a few dresses and blankets. The fire truck and many volunteers sped to the scene through sixty-below weather from Bear Creek but the old-time roadhouse burned to the ground.

The McDonnell's were Gold Rush pioneers and the Arlington known to hundreds of Yukoners, was built during the Gold Rush days.
