MOOSE CALF 'ADOPTS' MAN AS ITS MOTHER

Curt Mintz huddled in the bush with his two dogs for 20 minutes waiting for the cow moose to attack.

"There's no way you can come between a cow and a calf and live," Mintz said in an interview Monday. "I'd rather meet a grizzly."

But there was no attack.

Instead, Mintz became the adopted mother to a three-day-old female moose calf that now lives at the Yukon Game Farm on the Takhini Hot Springs Road.

Mintz came upon the moose on June 2 while strolling through the woods about four kilometres from his cabin on the Alaska Highway near Whitehorse.

"I heard it first, and I thought it was a bear, so I just dived down and grabbed the two dogs and held them.

"I knew whatever it was didn't hear me, 'cause it was making too much noise.

"When I saw it was calf sitting there, I was more worried. I thought, 'I came between a cow and a calf, I'm in really big trouble,' I stayed down there for about 20 minutes.

"I circled around the thing and saw it was a calf moose. So then I snuck up on it and within 10 feet, it heard me. It started crying just like a little baby."

That's when he realized it was alone. The calf was probably a twin and left behind by its mother, Mintz said. If the mother had been shot, he said, the calf would have stayed with the mother and the hunters would have gotten it. "It wouldn't have lasted overnight.

There's no doubt about it. It's like Grand Central Station out there for coyotes." He stroked the calf, grabbed it, put it

on his shoulders and marched four kilo-

metres back to his cabin with it. "After about maybe an hour or two, it figured I was its mother. If I walked away

from it, it would start crying." The calf wasn't afraid of people, he said. It liked his dogs, his friend's cat, and gave his guests big moose-lip kisses.

It would cry to eat, lay down, and go outside because it wanted Mintz to be closer to it.

It was three days old, so it couldn't follow him far. It would walk for a while, then stop and cry when Mintz continued.

"I entertained thoughts at one point in time of keeping it," Mintz said. But he decided it would be better for the moose if it went to the game farm. Danny Nowlan, owner of the Yukon Game Farm, is an old friend of Mintz's father.

Nowlan has had a bull moose for about 10 years, said Mintz, and he hasn't be able to find a cow.

So, this could be the beginning of a Yukon moose family bred in captivity.

7 rom present appearances White Horse is a haven of refuge for as tough a set of individuals as ever congregated in a town of this size. Toughs from Dawson, who have been served with "blue papers" by the N.W.M.P.; toughs who have made their presence so obnoxious that even Skagway, which is not famed for its morality, has seen fit to issue orders for their removal; toughs of all descriptions and varieties, from the macquereaux, who live on the earnings of fallen women, to the "macer" and bullying prize fighter, whose highest ambition is to get in some public place and pose before the audience as exponents of the manly art of self defense—these are among the evils which have recently invaded our hitherto peaceful community, like a swarm of locusts on a Kansas farm.

In early days in the northern country it was almost impossible to rid the country of this undesirable element, but things now wear an altogether different aspect. The towns of Yukon territory are being settled up by respectable and law abiding citizens and their families, and the courtesan and her "lover" are no longer looked upon with the same degree of leniency that they were when the population was composed almost entirely of men without family ties or other influences to regulate their daily lives.

In Dawson the moral wave has assumed such proportions that members of the demi-mode have been driven from their accustomed haunts and forced to seek refuge on the opposite side of the river from town. Even here in White Horse the police have issued an edict against women frequenting or patronizing saloons and it is now the duty of

those in authority to continue the good work they have begun and free us from the great-

er evil of the "toughs."

AN ATLIN ROAD AGENT

Masked Highwayman Holds Up a Stage in Real Western Style and Gets \$3.55

Atlin has had a genuine stage holdup. The work of the robber was shockingly crude. His method, or rather lack of it, demonstrated that he was not an expert in the profession, and that he was thoroughly in want of experience.

It happened Monday evening, Sept. 16, about 8 o'clock. Walker's stage was enroute to Pine City from Atlin when a masked highwayman stepped out in the road and at the point of a Winchester commanded the driver to halt. The command was obeyed and the passengers were ordered to get out of the stage and line up with their hands in the air. Four of the passengers, Messrs. D. Patterson, C.H. Dewitt, J. Dillon and Mrs. Nelson took to the woods. The others were Driver Walker, Photographer Draper, T.Shirley, W. Waters, J.Emmett and Miss Maud Biggs.

They had considerable money about them, but most of them managed to lose their purses in the stage before leaving it. The highwayman's order to them, therefore, to throw their money in a pile on the road resulted in only \$3.55 being contributed to the road agent. This he sulkily picked up, and backing into the brush, he disappeared.

The police were immediately notified and vigorous search made for the daring robber, but up to late reports he has not been caught.
