A CONSIGNMENT OF HOCKEY JUNK

It's not often a local hockey team has a chance to vie for the Stanley Cup, but it happened one time in Yukon history and the results of the contest make it probable that it will never happen again.

Hockey was big in the Klondike in 1904, and the competition so fierce that local promoters of the sport were looking for bigger and greater challenges. With the typical Yukon "if you're going to go for it you might as well go for the top' attitude, Dawson organizers wrote to Ottawa challenging the World Champions to a Stanley Cup duel. The challenge was accepted.

The Klondike team sallied forth from Dawson to do battle with the Ottawa Invincibles, also known as "The Silver Seven."

Ottawa Hockey Team Won First Game of Series by Score of 9-2. The Dawson Hockey team went down in overwhelming defeat before the Ottawa Invincibles by a score of 23-2 in the second.

1962 News from the Whitehorse Star

BURIED IN TRENCH

Two men were buried in a trench yesterday afternoon at the vocational school site when an earth and gravel wall collapsed on them. Most seriously injured was Ronald Burnett of Whitehorse who received a broken leg and a broken pelvis. Vernon Ekland received also a broken pelvis.

When the wall came down, the two men were working close together in the trench being dug to accommodate sewer and water pipes. They were completely covered by the slide but, fortunately, Bennett and White Superintendent Nelson Ford knew their exact location and, when the rescue effort began, he could pinpoint their location and dug them out.

The trench at the point of collapse was approximately 14 feet deep. About the first five feet were frozen ground but beneath that the gravel was loose.

Both city fire departments rushed to the scene and also workmen from other parts of the city were called to assist. It was Ekland's second trip to the hospital in three weeks. He was just released after a broken ankle healed.

YUKON TERRITORY'S FIRST ALBINO MOOSE

Yukon big game outfitter Alex Van Bibber of Champagne, Yukon, took the territory's first albino moose on October 3, 1968, in the Blanchard River area of southern Yukon, just north of the BC. border and east of Mile 94 of the Haines Road.

Van Bibber first spot- game outfitter, with territory's first albino moose. ted the cow moose while on a hunt, guiding William Portman of Oklahoma City on September 30. Later he and a group of hunters from Whitehorse; John Gatey, Jr., Francis Chambers, Francis Fromme and Alex's wife, Sue Van Bibber, returned to the area and bagged the albino during the Yukon's open cow moose season, along with two other cows and a light colored bull with a horn spread of sixty-three inches.
