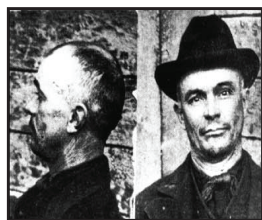

COLD BLOODED KILLERS

Peter Fournier under arrest suspected of being one of the Bouthilllette Murderers.

DAWSON - Yesterday Peter Fournier, who was known to have left Whitehorse on June 16th in a small boat with Leon Bouthilllette and Guy Joseph Beaudoin, whose bullet pierced bodies were found about a month ago in the Yukon river near Ogilvie, was arrested here. Four hundred dollars in Quebec bank notes were found on his person. The police are hot on the trail of a man named LaBelle, Fournier's partner, and who is also known to have been one of the party when it left Whitehorse. A man from Whitehorse has identified Fournier as being one of the party of five leaving Whitehorse for Dawson on June 16th inst.

Ed LaBelle, the partner of Peter Fournier, says that Fournier killed the men and threw their bodies into the river while he was absent from camp on a hunting expedition.

AN ATLIN ROAD AGENT

Masked Highwayman Holds Up a Stage in Real Western Style and Gets \$3.55

Atlin has had a genuine stage holdup. The work of the robber was shockingly crude. His method, or rather lack of it, demonstrated that he was not an expert in the profession, and that he was thoroughly in want of experience.

It happened Monday evening, Sept. 16, about 8 o'clock. Walker's stage was enroute to Pine City from Atlin when a masked highwayman stepped out in the road and at the point of a Winchester commanded the driver to halt. The command was obeyed and the passengers were ordered to get out of the stage and line up with their hands in the air. Four of the passengers, Messrs. D. Patterson, C.H. Dewitt, J. Dillon and Mrs. Nelson took to the woods. The others were Driver Walker, Photographer Draper, T. Shirley, W. Waters, J. Emmett and Miss Maud Biggs.

They had considerable money about them, but most of them managed to lose their purses in the stage before leaving it. The highwayman's order to them, therefore, to throw their money in a pile on the road resulted in only \$3.55 being contributed to the road agent. This he sulkily picked up, and backing into the brush, he disappeared.

The police were immediately notified and vigorous search made for the daring robber, but up to late reports he has not been caught.

A GRIM DEATH INDEED

WRECKAGE of the COLUMBIAN – The charred hull, which was a menace to navigation, was floated downstream a short way and abandoned in "Columbia" slough.

Of all the accidents that can befall a person on a boat surely an explosion and fire is one of the worst. Three tons of black powder exploded on the Columbian's forward deck that fateful September day and the resulting fireball was carried the length of the ship by a downstream wind. Everyone in the immediate vicinity of the explosion would die, except for passenger Ernest Winstanley. He would be saved by his long underwear.

The Purser, Lionel Cowper had been burned over his entire body. As was the medical custom at the time of the accident, he had been wrapped in an oily blanket and given strychnine pills. In Whitehorse, when it became obvious that he was going to die, massive amounts of "opiates" were administered, but relief lasted only minutes.
