TAKHINI SPRINGS hotographer E.J. Hamacher has favoured us with the

following description of the Takhini hot springs, the property of Messrs. W.A. Puckett and S.A. Simmons. The springs are distant from Whitehorse about 30 1/2 miles, 14 to the mouth of the Takhini river. 15 miles up that stream to the springs landing and one and a half miles from the river northward to the springs.

The springs are located in a beautiful spot almost level but sloping gently toward the river. The water boils up from a bowlshaped basin, overflows it at one edge, and runs over the sloping ground until it reaches a deep canyon through which it makes its way toward the river. At the foot of this canyon is a large cres cent shaped slough or lake which has an outlet to the river.

The volume of water which flows from the spring would fill a six-inch pipe and its deposits below the springs show large quantities of iron and lime. The temperature of the water is about 120 degrees, Fahrenheit.

THE WHITE DEATH

f all the natural phenomena peculiar to the Rocky mountain region none is more strange, or terrible than the mysterious storm known to the Indians as "the white death". Scientific men have never yet had an opportunity of investigating it, because it comes at the most unexpected times and may keep away from a certain locality for years. Well-read men who have been through it say that it is really a frozen fog. But where the fog comes from is more than anyone can say. This phenomenon occurs most frequently in the northern part of Colorado, in Wyoming, and occasionally in Montana.

About two years ago a party of three women and two men were crossing North Park in a wagon in the month of February. The air was bitterly cold, but dry as a bone and motionless. The sun shone with almost startling brilliancy. As the five people drove along over the crisp snow they did not experience the least cold, but really felt most comfortable, and rather enjoyed the trip. Mountain peaks fifty miles away could be seen as distinctly as the pine trees beside the roadside.

Suddenly one of the women put her hand up to her face and remarked that something had stung her. Then other members of the party did the same thing, although not a sign of an insect could be seen. All marveled greatly at this. A moment later they noticed that the distant mountains were disappearing behind a cloud of mist. Mist in Colorado in February? Surely there must be some mistake. But there was no mistake, because within ten minutes a gentle wind began to blow and the air became filled with fine particles of something that scintillated like diamond dust in the sunshine. Still the people drove on until they came to a cabin where a man signaled them to stop. With his head tied up in a bundle of mufflers, he rushed out and handed the driver a piece of paper on which was written: 'Come into the house quick, or this storm will kill all of you. Don't talk outside here."

Of course no time was lost in getting under cover and putting the horses in the stable. But they were a little too late, for in less than an hour the whole party was sick with violent coughs and fever. Before the next morning one of the women died with all the symptoms of pneumonia. The others were violently ill of it, but managed to pull through after long sickness. - Aisle's Magazine

The Champagne and Aishihik First Nations (CAFN) is inviting public proposals from experienced licensed individual attorneys and/or law firms who have the qualifications and capacity to provide legal advice and services in relation to employment matters in the Yukon Territory. CAFN intends to enter a retainer agreement for the services identified below.

Background: The Shadhäla Äshèyi yè Kwädän (Champagne and Aishihik First Nations or CAFN) is a self-governing First Nation located in the Yukon Territory and northwest British Columbia, Canada. The Champagne and Aishihik people and government are named after two historic settlements: Shadhäla (Champagne), located on the Dezadeash River; and Äshèyi (Aishihik), at the headwaters of the Alsek River drainage. CAFN has more than 1,200 Dän (people) and is one of the largest of the 14 Yukon First Nations. CAFN currently has approximately 140 employees. The CAFN's main government office is located in Haines Junction, with offices in Takhini and Whitehorse.

CAFN has identified certain requirements and expectations that should be incorporated into the proposal. These requirements and expectations will be the provided by the Service provider including but not limited to the following:

> The individual/firm shall be readily available to perform the following legal services as requested.

- · Advise on legal matters related to individual labor and employment matters
- Drafting and/or review for legal correctness and acceptability; legal documents, contracts, severance agreements, termination and other legal drafting, as requested
- Defend lawsuits, administrative claims or legal claims
- · Conduct litigation, as necessary
- Advise on Human Resources policy and/or procedures that impact CAFN, as necessary
- > The proposal should demonstrate considerable knowledge of applicable laws; Canada Labour Code (Part 2 and 3), Personal Information Protection and Electronic Documents Act, Canadian Human Rights Act, Workers Compensation, Health and Safety Act, and the Employment Insurance Act.
- Experience with current labour relations issues such as managing for COVID in the workplace should also be identified (testing, accommodation, vaccine mandates, etc.)
- How the attorney or law firm treats its client representatives is very important to CAFN. The proposal must describe who will be the firm's primary contact, how accessible the firm is and what the process is for changing the firms' primary contact person if required. The
- proposer should identify the average responses times for both critical and routine inquiries from CAFN • The proposal should describe how it would keep client communications and information
- safe and confidential. Provide services in a manner sensitive to the culture and traditions of First Nations;

Proposals submitted should include the attorney's or law firm's business name and address, qualifications and experience. They should identify this information for all members of the legal team that will be providing services under this contract. Proposals will be evaluated based on relevant qualifications and experience, the quality of the proposal submitted and a proposal that addresses all the requirements mentioned above, the contractor's ability to complete work in accordance with the deadline and the proposed price. CAFN need not accept the lowest priced, the highest ranked, or any proposal, and reserves the right to reject or accept any proposal without further explanation.
