TORNADO HITS WATSON LAKE

What has been described as being a phenomena in this part of Canada occurred on Wednesday, September 9 between two and 3:00 p.m. when a tornado formed over Watson lake, raced down the far shore opposite the airport and up the bank to dissipate somewhere in the bush by the tank farm. The tornado was accompanied by a short but extremely heavy hail storm with some of the stones measuring three-quarters of an inch in diameter.

Pete Koszuk, the only known eye-witness to the forming of the tornado said the water began to swirl and gradually lift off the surface.

Evidence of its violence can be seen on the path it took when it struck the lake shore. Poplar, jack pine and spruce trees varying in height 30 to 70 feet and four to 10 inches in diameter were uprooted and piled together like matches. Fortunately the tornado struck only the lake and the trees.

MOOSE CALF 'ADOPTS' MAN AS ITS MOTHER

Curt Mintz huddled in the bush with his two dogs for 20 minutes waiting for the cow moose to attack.

"There's no way you can come between a cow and a calf and live," Mintz said in an interview Monday. "I'd rather meet a grizzly."

But there was no attack.

Instead, Mintz became the adopted mother to a three-day-old female moose calf that now lives at the Yukon Game Farm on the Takhini Hot Springs Road.

Mintz came upon the moose on June 2 while strolling through the woods about four kilometres from his cabin on the Alaska Highway near Whitehorse.

"I heard it first, and I thought it was a bear, so I just dived down and grabbed the two dogs and held them.

"I knew whatever it was didn't hear me, 'cause it was making too much noise.

"When I saw it was calf sitting there, I was more worried. I thought, 'I came between a cow and a calf, I'm in really big trouble.' I stayed down there for about 20 minutes.

"I circled around the thing and saw it was a calf moose. So then I snuck up on it and within 10 feet, it heard me. It started crying just like a little baby."

That's when he realized it was alone.

The calf was probably a twin and left behind by its mother, Mintz said. If the mother had been shot, he said, the calf would have stayed with the mother and the hunters would have gotten it.

"It wouldn't have lasted overnight. There's no doubt about it. It's like Grand Central Station out there for coyotes."

He stroked the calf, grabbed it, put it on his shoulders and marched four kilometres back to his cabin with it.

"After about maybe an hour or two, it figured I was its mother. If I walked away from it, it would start crying."

The calf wasn't afraid of people, he said. It liked his dogs, his friend's cat, and gave his guests big moose-lip kisses.

It would cry to eat, lay down, and go outside because it wanted Mintz to be closer to it.

It was three days old, so it couldn't follow him far. It would walk for a while, then stop and cry when Mintz continued.

"I entertained thoughts at one point in time of keeping it," Mintz said. But he decided it would be better for the moose if it went to the game farm. Danny Nowlan, owner of the Yukon Game Farm, is an old friend of Mintz's father.

Nowlan has had a bull moose for about 10 years, said Mintz, and he hasn't be able to find a cow.

So, this could be the beginning of a Yukon moose family bred in captivity.

**TAKHINI SPRINGS**

Photographer E.J. Hamacher has favoured us with the following description of the Takhini hot springs, the property of Messrs. W.A. Puckett and S.A. Simmons. The springs are distant from Whitehorse about 30 1/2 miles, 14 to the mouth of the Takhini river, 15 miles up that stream to the springs landing and one and a half miles from the river northward to the springs.

The springs are located in a beautiful spot almost level but sloping gently toward the river. The water boils up from a bowl-shaped basin, overflows it at one edge, and runs over the sloping ground until it reaches a deep canyon through which it makes its way toward the river. At the foot of this canyon is a large crescent shaped slough or lake which has an outlet to the river.

The volume of water which flows from the spring would fill a six-inch pipe and its deposits below the springs show large quantities of iron and lime. The temperature of the water is about 120 degrees, Fahrenheit.

During the past few days the traffic department of the White Pass & Yukon Route has contracted in advance for all the cold storage space on its rail and steamer lines from Skagway to Dawson for the entire season.

The contracts held amount in the aggregate to 1000 tons of freight. This will be chiefly fruits, fresh eggs, poultry, fresh meats, and vegetables.

This is an entirely new business in Alaska transportation annals. The construction of

three new steamers on the upper Yukon by the White Pass company, equipped with cold storage apparatus, was the last step taken in the matter of arranging or cold storage shipments this year by the traffic department.

The steamers equipped in this manner are the Ogilvie, McConnell and Dawson. Each will have a capacity of 20 tons. Skagway News.

TOUGHEST MAN TITLE

B.C. Teenager Takes Heavyweight Crown

The Dawson City man who represented Canada in boxing at the 1982 Commonwealth Games in Brisbane, Australia was back in the ring Thursday night in front of 1,200 to 1,500 fans at Takhini Arena.

George Mason, 32, earned the title as the Toughest man in the Yukon and \$1,000 in the 70 kg (154 lbs) and under category.


Shane Sutcliffe of Nanaimo, B. C. won the heavy weight category of 82 kg (180 lbs) and over and Jeff MacPheat of Whitehorse took home the purse in the middle weight division.

The event was billed as the Toughest Man in the Yukon competition with invitations going out to street fighters, bikers, martial artists, brawlers and bouncers.

It was actually an amateur boxing card where conditioning an experience proved more valuable than braun.

Kevin White, a 32-year-old Whitehorse man who challenged 16-year-old Shane Sutcliffe for the heavyweight title, voluntarily withdrew after two rounds because he simply ran out of gas.

“When I sat down after the second round I thought I was in there for about 10 minutes.” said White of the minute-and-a-half round. “ I was too tired to throw
