MOOSE CALF 'ADOPTS' MAN AS ITS MOTHER'

Yurt Mintz huddled \checkmark in the bush with his two dogs for 20 minutes waiting for the cow moose to attack.

"There's no way you can come between a cow and a calf and live," Mintz said in an interview Monday. "I'd rather meet a grizzly."

But there was no attack. came the adopted mother to a three-day-old female moose calf that now lives at the Yukon Game Farm on the Takhini Hot Springs Road.

Mintz came upon the moose on June 2 while strolling through the woods about four kilometres from his cabin on the Alaska Highway near Whitehorse.

"I heard it first, and I thought it was a bear, so I just dived down and grabbed the two dogs and held them.

"I knew whatever it was didn't hear me, 'cause it was making too much noise.

"When I saw it was calf sitting there, I was more worried. I thought, 'I came between a cow and a calf, I'm in really big trouble,' I stayed down there for about 20 minutes.

"I circled around the thing and saw it was a calf moose. So then I snuck up on it and within 10 feet, it heard me. It started crying just like a little baby."

That's when he realized it was alone.

The calf was probably a twin and left behind by its mother, Mintz said. If the mother had been shot, he said, the calf would have stayed with the mother and the hunters would have gotten it.

"It wouldn't have lasted overnight. There's no doubt about it. It's like Grand Central Station out there for coyotes."

He stroked the calf, grabbed it, put it on his shoulders and marched four kilometres back to his cabin with it.

"After about maybe an hour or two, it figured I was its mother. If I walked away from it, it would start crying."

The calf wasn't afraid of people, he said. It liked his dogs, his friend's cat, and gave his guests big moose-lip kisses.

It would cry to eat, lay down, and go outside because it wanted Mintz to be closer to it.

It was three days old, so it couldn't follow him far. It would walk for a while, then stop and cry when Mintz continued.

"I entertained thoughts at one point in time of keeping it," Mintz said. But he decided it would be better for the moose if it went to the game farm. Danny Nowlan, owner of the Yukon Game Farm, is an old friend of Mintz's father.

Nowlan has had a bull moose for about 10 years, said Mintz, and he hasn't be able to find a cow.

So, this could be the beginning of a Yukon moose family bred in captivity.

THE WHITE DEATH

f all the natural phenomena peculiar to the Rocky mountain region none is more strange, or terrible than the mysterious storm known to the Indians as "the white death". Scientific men have never yet had an opportunity of investigating it, because it comes at the most unexpected times and may keep away from a certain locality for years. Well-read men who have been through it say that it is really a frozen fog. But where the fog comes from is more than anyone can say. This phenomenon occurs most frequently in the northern part of Colorado, in Wyoming, and occasionally in Montana.

About two years ago a party of three women and two men were crossing North Park in a wagon in the month of February. The air was bitterly cold, but dry as a bone and motionless. The sun shone with almost startling brilliancy. As the five people drove along over the crisp snow they did not experience the least cold, but really felt most comfortable, and rather enjoyed the trip. Mountain peaks fifty miles away could be seen as distinctly as the pine trees beside the roadside.

Suddenly one of the women put her hand up to her face and remarked that something had stung her. Then other members of the party did the same thing, although not a sign of an insect could be seen. All marveled greatly at this. A moment later they noticed that the distant mountains were disappearing behind a cloud of mist. Mist in Colorado in February? Surely there must be some mistake. But there was no mistake, because within ten minutes a gentle wind began to blow and the air became filled with fine particles of something that scintillated like diamond dust in the sunshine. Still the people drove on until they came to a cabin where a man signaled them to stop. With his head tied up in a bundle of mufflers, he rushed out and handed the driver a piece of paper on which was written: "Come into the house quick, or this storm will kill all of you. Don't talk outside here."

Of course no time was lost in getting under cover and putting the horses in the stable. But they were a little too late, for in less than an hour the whole party was sick with violent coughs and fever. Before the next morning one of the women died with all the symptoms of pneumonia. The others were violently ill of it, but managed to pull through after long sickness. - Aisle's Magazine
