MOOSE CALF 'ADOPTS' MAN AS ITS MOTHER

Curt Mintz huddled in the bush with his two dogs for 20 minutes waiting for the cow moose to attack.

"There's no way you can come between a cow and a calf and live," Mintz said in an interview Monday. "I'd rather meet a grizzly."

But there was no attack. Instead, Mintz became the adopted mother to a three-day-old female moose calf that now lives at the Yukon Game Farm on the Takhini Hot Springs Road.

Mintz came upon the moose on June 2 while strolling through the woods about four kilometres from his cabin on the Alaska Highway near Whitehorse.

"I heard it first, and I thought it was a bear, so I just dived down and grabbed the two dogs and held them.

"I knew whatever it was didn't hear me, 'cause it was making too much noise.

"When I saw it was calf sitting there, I was more worried. I thought, 'I came between a cow and a calf, I'm in really big trouble,' I stayed down there for about 20 minutes.

"I circled around the thing and saw it was a calf moose. So then I snuck up on it and within 10 feet, it heard me. It started crying just like a little baby."

That's when he realized it was alone. The calf was probably a twin and left behind by its mother, Mintz said. If the mother had been shot, he said, the calf would have stayed with the mother and the hunters would have gotten it.

"It wouldn't have lasted overnight. There's no doubt about it. It's like Grand Central Station out there for coyotes."

He stroked the calf, grabbed it, put it on his shoulders and marched four kilometres back to his cabin with it.

"After about maybe an hour or two, it figured I was its mother. If I walked away from it, it would start crying."

The calf wasn't afraid of people, he said. It liked his dogs, his friend's cat, and gave his guests big moose-lip kisses.

It would cry to eat, lay down, and go outside because it wanted Mintz to be closer to it.

It was three days old, so it couldn't follow him far. It would walk for a while, then stop and cry when Mintz continued.

"I entertained thoughts at one point in time of keeping it," Mintz said. But he decided it would be better for the moose if it went to the game farm. Danny Nowlan, owner of the Yukon Game Farm, is an old friend of Mintz's father.

Nowlan has had a bull moose for about 10 years, said Mintz, and he hasn't be able to find a cow.

So, this could be the beginning of a Yukon moose family bred in captivity.

Sealed bids marked "Bid for Atlin Wastewater Lagoon, Contract 1 – Removals and Tree Clearing" will be received by email, up to **2:00 pm local time on Thursday, September 22, 2022**, at owenm@ae.ca. Bids submitted after the closing time will not be accepted. Bidders accept the responsibility to ensure the bid is received prior to the closing time.

The work involves the demolition and removal of the existing sewage treatment system and disposal of associated infrastructure, including but not limited to, reinforced concrete from flow equalization tanks, septic tanks, effluent pumps station, etc., waste material, PVC piping, pumps, valves, etc. The existing sewage treatment system was never commissioned, therefore is not considered hazardous waste. Work also involves tree clearing and grubbing of approximately 6.7 hectares of primarily spruce and pine trees, stockpiling the salvageable timber, and disposing of the non-salvageable timber, grubbing, etc.

The project contains a **MANDATORY** Indigenous Participation Requirement (IPR).

The Dawson Hold-Up

Mat Tomerlin Confesses His Guilt and Implicates
Brophy as His Partner in Crime

Dawson, Dec. 28 – Mat Tomerlin, who was held over on his preliminary hearing a few weeks ago on a charge of being one of the men that held up the Dominion gambling house here, on the 15th of last November, has made a full confession of his guilt, implicating William Brophy as the "short man," and his partner in the crime.

Immediately after the hold-up Brophy, who was suspicioned as being one of the robbers, was arrested and brought before the court, but on his preliminary examination the evidence was of such slight nature that he was dismissed.

Finding that Brophy could not be held on the charge of robbery another of vagrancy was entered against him, but this also failed, and about three weeks ago he was discharged from custody. He is now supposed to be con-

cealed in some cabin either in this city or on one of the creeks. A reward has been offered for his apprehension.

Tomerlin this morning accompanied the police to where he had hidden his share of the money amounting to \$700 and it was recovered.

In extenuation of his crime, Tomerlin says that just previous to its commission his wife had left him and being broke he was desperate and did not care what chances he took to secure money, but would have killed himself in the gambling room at the time of the hold-up rather than to have harmed any man there had there been any resistance offered.
