TORNADO HITS WATSON LAKE

What has been described as being a phenomena in this part of Canada occurred on Wednesday, September 9 between two and 3:00 p.m. when a tornado formed over Watson lake, raced down the far shore opposite the airport and up the bank to dissipate somewhere in the bush by the tank farm.

The tornado was accompanied by a short but extremely heavy hail storm with some of the stones measuring three-quarters of an inch in diameter.

Pete Koszuk, the only known eye-witness to the forming of the tornado said the water began to swirl and gradually lift off the surface.

Evidence of its violence can be seen on the path it took when it struck the lake shore. Poplar, jack pine and spruce trees varying in height 30 to 70 feet and four to 10 inches in diameter were uprooted and piled together like matches.

Fortunately the tornado struck only the lake and the trees.

1902 News from the Whitehorse Star

A Record Breaker

Last fall Supt. Gen. E. Pulham made the assertion that before the winter was over he would break all previous records of fast travel between White Horse and Dawson and last night he arrived from the latter point in a W.P. & Y. Route stage that made the heretofore unprecedented time of 3 days and 10 hours.

Although the early part of the season on the winter trail offered many obstacles for rapid traveling Mr. Pulham did not lose his nerve but went ahead with his work and under his management the W.P. & Y. Route has furnished a regular, rapid and easy, even luxurious, means of reaching the Klondike capital from the northern terminus of the railroad.

For doing this work Mr. Pulham has had every facility that money could procure, and in addition has had the assistance of an exceptionally competent staff of assistants. This end of the line has been well and closely looked after by Assistant Supt. H. Wheeler, while the stage drivers employed have acquired skill through years of experience in the north.

The fastest round trip on record between White Horse and Dawson was that made by Driver Jack

McMillan who returned here a few days ago after an absence of only 8 days and 2 hours.

The management of the W.P. & Y. Route have made special efforts this season to meet the requirements of the interior transportation business. Although their contract only calls for a five day service hardly a day has passed since the road got in good shape but that one or more stages have not left White Horse and a like number arrived. From four and a half to five days are usually consumed on a single trip unless the weather happens to be bad, when it requires a little more time.

The result of this policy of the W.P. & Y. Route has been that they have secured most of the passenger traffic and even those who have gone on other stage lines at reduced rates of fare have kicked themselves, so to speak, before the end of their journey was reached, for the reason that it had taken from a week to ten days longer to make the trip in much less comfortable conveyances, and their extra expenses for the additional time spent on the road have more than equalled the difference of fare between the independent lines and that of the W.P. & Y. Route.

1901 News from the Whitehorse Star

The New Gold Strike

The first authentic news to be received from the new strike on Livingstone creek in the Big Salmon country is that brought out by Mr. Leonard Matchett who, though not the discoverer, was one of the first locators on the creek. The discoverers were some former employees of Mr. J.C. Tache, who went into the country last summer and, having found good prospects on a tributary of Livingstone creek, took up claims and started to work to reach bedrock, but the ground was frozen so hard and they encountered so much water that they were unable to accomplish much.

Mr. Matchett is a practical miner of over 20 years experience, and last summer worked on the War Eagle mine in White Horse district. Of the new strike, he says:

"The discovery was made by the LaRose brothers and others, and is six miles below Livingstone. It is seven miles from the gulch to the summit and 15 miles from there to the Hootalinqua. It is the finest glacial wash I ever saw, and I have been engaged in mining for the past 20 years.

"When I left there were 22 claims recorded and as I met quite a number going in on my outward trip, I suppose by this time there are a great many more.

"I washed out some of the dirt on one of the dumps and as a result secured 5 cwt of gold. The gulch is full of large boulders and it is going to take considerable capital and a good deal of hard work to get down to bedrock, but I am fully convinced from what I have seen that the ground will warrant the outlay.

"After I had staked my claim I went down the river about 100 miles to record, but when I reached the post the recorder was absent. I think some effort should be made by the peo-

ple of White Horse to have the recorder's office for that district located here, as it is the proper and most convenient place to have it.

"The much talked of winter trail from White Horse to the Big Salmon should be built at once. It will save half the distance between the two places and is a very easy way to get in. As near as I can estimate, the distance by the cut-off to Livingstone is 80 miles, while by the way of Hootalinqua it is about 160 miles. The worst part of the shorter route is the first four miles out from La Barge, and consists of a few steep bluffs, which, however, can be easily surmounted by building sidehill grades. The rest of the way is plain sailing until the Hootalinqua is reached, when another grade will have to be made to reach the river. From there on to the mines a good trail has already been built.

"The trade from the Big Salmon country during the coming season is going to be large, and the business men of White Horse ought to get in and work to secure it. On my way out I met a party of 35 men going in under contract to work for Mr. O'Brien of Dawson, and I understand that he intends to increase this force to 80 as soon as he can get things in shape. There are at present about 250 men in the district and in all probability there will be a great many more in a short time. I heard it reported that one company intends to spend \$50,000 in development work during the coming summer.

"At present supplies of all kinds are very high. Flour is \$28 per 100 pounds; bacon 38¢ per pound; ham 50¢; tobacco \$2 and rubber boots \$16 per pair, and very poor boots at that."

1962 News from the Whitehorse Star

Start Flats Move

Removal of buildings from squatter areas in Whitehorse is to commence at once. Northern affairs and territorial officials made the announcement today.

The first step will be moving all buildings not being used for residential purposes. Areas involved include Crown land on Whiskey Flats, Moccasin Flats, Sleepy Hollow, West of Eighth Avenue and on the Two Mile.

The government will move these buildings without charge at the request of the owners to privately owned or leased land anywhere within a 10-miles radius of the city.

The free move applies only to buildings which meet the standards of the area to which they are to be moved. Detailed information concerning the proposed move is available at Room 306 in the federal building.

The government spokesmen said residential buildings will be moved at a

later date.

Initial announcement of the program for clearing these areas was made prior to the Lot 19 plebiscite. At that time the government indicated it intended to remove buildings from the various squatter areas where Crown land was involved.

Territorial subdivisions to which buildings may now be moved, if they meet the standards, include Crestview at Mile 923 and Canyon Crescent at Mile 912. Seventy-five new lots will be available at Porter Creek upon completion of the plan of survey which is expected to be finished very soon.

A transient area, where land may be leased, is being cleared now North of the Two Mile Hill. Minimum standards will apply there, commensurate with health and sanitation requirements. It is expected to be open in early summer, dependent upon securing a good water supply.
