A GANG OF TOUGHS

Trom present appearances White Horse is a haven of refuge for as tough a set of individuals as ever congregated in a town of this size. Toughs from Dawson, who have been served with "blue papers" by the N.W.M.P.; toughs who have made their presence so obnoxious that even Skagway, which is not famed for its morality, has seen fit to issue orders for their removal; toughs of all descriptions and varieties, from the macquereaux, who live on the earnings of fallen women, to the "macer" and bullying prize fighter, whose highest ambition is to get in some public place and pose before the audience as exponents of the manly art of self defense—these are among the evils which have recently invaded our hitherto peaceful community, like a swarm of locusts on a Kansas farm.

In early days in the northern country it was almost impossible to rid the country of this undesirable element, but things now wear an altogether different aspect. The towns of Yukon territory are being settled up by respectable and law abiding citizens and their families, and the courtesan and her "lover" are no longer looked upon with the same degree of leniency that they were when the population was composed almost entirely of men without family ties or other influences to regulate their daily lives.

In Dawson the moral wave has assumed such proportions that members of the demi-mode have been driven from their accustomed haunts and forced to seek refuge on the opposite side of the river from town. Even here in White Horse the

police have issued an edict against women frequenting or patronizing saloons and it is now the duty of those in authority to continue the good work

they have begun and free us from the greater evil of the "toughs."

MARTHA BENJAMIN: CANADIAN CHAMP

"Martha beats them all" a STAR headline proclaimed in 1963 when an Old Crow skier and mother of five children became the first Yukoner to win a national skiing title.

Twenty-five year old Martha Benjamin won the senior women's cross country skiing title at the Canadian championships in Midland, Ontario. Her time over the 10 kilometre race was 43.29 minutes. And in 1989, 26 years after that historic event, Benjamin was inducted in the Yukon Sports Hall of Fame. "After all these years, I didn't expect to receive something like this," she said. "I just had it in me that I wanted to do it, and I did it," she said of her win in Midland Ontario.

Benjamin and Ben Charlie were the only two skiers to attend the championships. Charlie ranked 11th in a field of 48. His toughest competition came from a group of Finns from Sudbury who swept the field.

Both skiers brought high credit and distinction (not to mention the publicity) to their community and to the Yukon as a whole. Star correspondent Edith Josie wrote before they left: "I had wire from Mr. Harry at Whitehorse. He said Ben Charlie and Mrs. Martha Benjamin will go to Ottawa for International Olympic Competition for skiers on February 13. Frank Cook will take them out. Everyone is very glad to hear these two will go out long travel. Hope they had good trip. Old Crow is little town and Father Mouchet is training boys and girls for the skiers. Now they even go way out to Ottawa. Sure big surorise for the people in Old Crow.
