BURIED IN TRENCH

Two men were buried in a trench yesterday afternoon at the vocational school site when an earth and gravel wall collapsed on them. Most seriously injured was Ronald Burnett of Whitehorse who received a broken leg and a broken pelvis. Vernon Ekland received also a broken pelvis.

When the wall came down, the two men were working close together in the trench being dug to accommodate sewer and water pipes. They were completely covered by the slide but, fortunately, Bennett and White Superintendent Nelson Ford knew their exact location and, when the rescue effort began, he could pinpoint their location and dug them out.

The trench at the point of collapse was approximately 14 feet deep. About the first five feet were frozen ground but beneath that the gravel was loose. Both city fire departments rushed to the scene and also workmen from other parts of the city were called to assist.

It was Ekland's second trip to the hospital in three weeks. He was just released after a broken ankle healed.

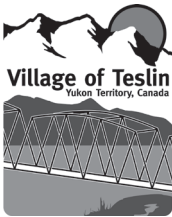

MOOSE CALF 'ADOPTS'
MAN AS ITS MOTHER

Curt Mintz huddled
in the bush with his
two dogs for 20 minutes
waiting for the cow moose
to attack.

"There's no way you
can come between a
cow and a calf and live,"
Mintz said in an inter-
view Monday. "I'd rath-
er meet a grizzly."

But there was no attack.

Instead, Mintz be-
came the adopted moth-
er to a three-day-old
female moose calf that
now lives at the Yukon
Game Farm on the Takhi-
ni Hot Springs Road.

Mintz came upon the moose on June 2 while strolling through
the woods about four kilometres from his cabin on the Alaska
Highway near Whitehorse.

"I heard it first, and I thought it was a bear, so I just dived
down and grabbed the two dogs and held them.

"I knew whatever it was didn't hear me, 'cause it was making
too much noise.

"When I saw it was calf sitting there, I was more worried.
I thought, 'I came between a cow and a calf, I'm in really big
trouble,' I stayed down there for about 20 minutes.

"I circled around the thing and saw it was a calf moose. So
then I snuck up on it and within 10 feet, it heard me. It started
crying just like a little baby."

That's when he realized it was alone.

The calf was probably a twin and left behind by its moth-
er, Mintz said. If the mother had been shot, he said, the calf
would have stayed with the mother and the hunters would
have gotten it.

"It wouldn't have lasted overnight. There's no doubt about it.
It's like Grand Central Station out there for coyotes."

He stroked the calf, grabbed it, put it on his shoulders and
marched four kilometres back to his cabin with it.

"After about maybe an hour or two, it figured I was its mother.
If I walked away from it, it would start crying."

The calf wasn't afraid of people, he said. It liked his dogs, his
friend's cat, and gave his guests big moose-lip kisses.

It would cry to eat, lay down, and go outside because it wanted
Mintz to be closer to it.

It was three days old, so it couldn't follow him far. It would
walk for a while, then stop and cry when Mintz continued.

"I entertained thoughts at one point in time of keeping it,"
Mintz said. But he decided it would be better for the moose if
it went to the game farm. Danny Nowlan, owner of the Yukon
Game Farm, is an old friend of Mintz's father.

Nowlan has had a bull moose for about 10 years, said Mintz,
and he hasn't be able to find a cow.

So, this could be the beginning of a Yukon moose family bred
in captivity.

The Dawson Hold-Up

Mat Tomerlin Confesses His Guilt and Implicates
Brophy as His Partner in Crime

Dawson, Dec. 28 – Mat Tomerlin, who
was held over on his preliminary hearing a
few weeks ago on a charge of being one of
the men that held up the Dominion gambling
house here, on the 15th of last November, has
made a full confession of his guilt, implicat-
ing William Brophy as the "short man," and
his partner in the crime.

Immediately after the hold-up Brophy,
who was suspicioned as being one of the
robbers, was arrested and brought before the
court, but on his preliminary examination the
evidence was of such slight nature that he was
dismissed.

Finding that Brophy could not be held on
the charge of robbery another of vagrancy
was entered against him, but this also failed,
and about three weeks ago he was discharged
from custody. He is now supposed to be con-

cealed in some cabin either in this city or on
one of the creeks. A reward has been offered
for his apprehension.

Tomerlin this morning accompanied the
police to where he had hidden his share of
the money amounting to \$700 and it was
recovered.

In extenuation of his crime, Tomerlin says
that just previous to its commission his wife
had left him and being broke he was desper-
ate and did not care what chances he took to
secure money, but would have killed him-
self in the gambling room at the time of the
hold-up rather than to have harmed any man
there had there been any resistance offered.

\$2 BILLION PROJECT
TO FLOOD CITY

Details of plans of an Eastern
Canadian industrial empire
to change the entire map north of
the B.C. border:

Included in the plans of the giant
Frobisher Ltd., for the \$2 billion
enterprise - which would dwarf the
huge Kitimat and Ungava develop-
ment - were:

Mammoth dam on Lac Laberge
and creation of a lake, 100 to 200
feet deep and covering thousands
of square miles.

Moving of the entire town of
Whitehorse with its huge Orient
route air base.

Relocation of the towns of Car-
cross and Champagne. (All three
centres would be flooded by the
artificial lake.)

Changing the route of warborn
Alaska highway, Rerouting of the
White Pass and Yukon Railway.

Construction of the three big hy-
dro plants in the vicinity of Kluane
Chilkoot Pass and Teslin. Estimated
out - 500,000,000 horsepower -
makes this the largest integrated
power yield in the world.

Creation of a deepsea port on
Taku River or north of Haines, Al-
aska, in Yukon territory.
