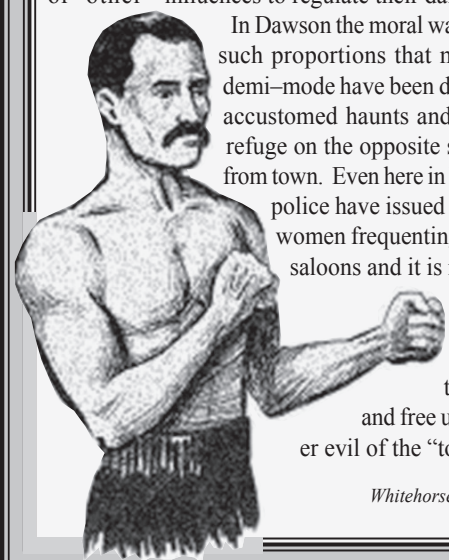

A GANG OF TOUGHS

From present appearances White Horse is a haven
of refuge for as tough a set of individuals as ever
congregated in a town of this size. Toughs from
Dawson, who have been served with "blue papers" by the
N.W.M.P.; toughs who have made their presence so obnox-
ious that even Skagway, which is not famed for its morality,
has seen fit to issue orders for their removal; toughs of all
descriptions and varieties, from the macquereaux, who live
on the earnings of fallen women, to the "macer" and bullying
prize fighter, whose highest ambition is to get in some public
place and pose before the audience as exponents of the manly
art of self defense—these are among the evils which have
recently invaded our hitherto peaceful community, like a
swarm of locusts on a Kansas farm.

In early days in the northern country it was almost im-
possible to rid the country of this undesirable element, but
things now wear an altogether different aspect. The towns
of Yukon territory are being settled up by respectable and
law abiding citizens and their families, and the courtesan
and her "lover" are no longer looked upon with the same
degree of leniency that they were when the population
was composed almost entirely of men without family ties
or other influences to regulate their daily lives.



In Dawson the moral wave has assumed
such proportions that members of the
demi-monde have been driven from their
accustomed haunts and forced to seek
refuge on the opposite side of the river
from town. Even here in White Horse the
police have issued an edict against
women frequenting or patronizing
saloons and it is now the duty of
those in author-
ity to continue
the good work
they have begun
and free us from the great-
er evil of the "toughs."

Yukon Territory's contribution to the Empire and Allied cause in this war is nothing short of magnificent.

Despite the fact the region is remote and the people are engaged in struggling against primitive and exceptionally obdurate and severe conditions in pioneering, they have more than held their own in the war game.

Between four and five hundred men have gone from this territory direct to the war, meaning practically ten per cent of the population of Yukon are under arms in Europe. Were the whole of the Dominion, with its eight million people, to contribute in like proportion to Yukon there would be 800,000 men, or just twice as many enlisted from Canada today as there are. ...

The generous and patriotic spirit of Yukon deserves to be known throughout the Empire and Allied realm. If all the Empire were contributing in like proportion in men and money the assembled wealth and armies today would be far greater than they are. But these matters will adjust themselves.

Yukoners will continue to do a mighty share and uphold the tradition that the sons and daughters of the North are excelled by none in loyalty to the nation and to humanity.

DAWSON CRIMINAL RE-CAPTURED AFTER A YEAR'S HUNT

SWAN HARRISON, AN INSANE PATIENT ARRESTED IN THE NORTHWEST TERRITORIES

Swan Harrison, who escaped from the Northwest Mounted police at Selkirk on the Yukon a year ago, has just been captured by members of the same efficient force at a point thousands of miles distant. Harrison has been taken a prisoner in the Northwest territories.

A telegram has been received by Major Wood at Dawson telling him of the capture of Harrison.

When Harrison escaped at Selkirk he was being taken out of the Yukon to New Westminster, B.C. as an insane patient. He had been arrested and convicted at Dawson some time before for stealing, had become insane while in prison and was transferred to the lunatic ward.

While the steamer was lying at Selkirk Harrison made a leap from the boat, and landing partly in the water walked ashore, scrambled away up the bank and ran into the woods before he could be overtaken. He and a number of other lunatics were in charge of Corpl. Stewart on the trip up the river. A short search was made for Harrison, but he could not be found, and the boat proceeded with the remainder of the party.

From traces obtained it is believed he went down the Yukon river and escaped by way of St. Michael or Nome. He is said to be from the States, but how it is that he should wander over into the Northwest Territories is scarcely understood. It was thought at first from the point at which the fellow turned up he must have taken a chance at the famous Edmonton trail and gotten through, but the idea is scarcely credited.
