Start Flats Move

Removal of buildings from squatter areas in Whitehorse is to commence at once. Northern affairs and territorial officials made the announcement today.

The first step will be moving all buildings not being used for residential purposes. Areas involved include Crown land on Whiskey Flats, Moccasin Flats, Sleepy Hollow, West of Eighth Avenue and on the Two Mile.

The government will move these buildings without charge at the request of the owners to privately owned or leased land anywhere within a 10- miles radius of the city.

The free move applies only to buildings which meet the standards of the area to which they are to be moved.

Detailed information concerning the proposed move is available at Room 306 in the federal building.

The government spokesmen said residential buildings will be moved at a later date.

Initial announcement of the program for clearing these areas was made prior to the Lot 19 plebiscite. At that time the government indicated it intended to remove buildings from the various squatter areas where Crown land was involved.

Territorial subdivisions to which buildings may now be moved, if they meet the standards, include Crestview at Mile 923 and Canyon Crescent at Mile 912. Seventy-five new lots will be available at Porter Creek upon completion of the plan of survey which is expected to be finished very soon.

A transient area, where land may be leased, is being cleared now North of the Two Mile Hill. Minimum standards will apply there, commensurate with health and sanitation requirements. It is expected to be open in early summer, dependent upon securing a good water supply.

A CONSIGNMENT
OF HOCKEY JUNK

It's not often a local hockey team has a chance to vie for the Stanley Cup, but it happened one time in Yukon history and the results of the contest make it probable that it will never happen again.

Hockey was big in the Klondike in 1904, and the competition so fierce that local promoters of the sport were looking for bigger and greater challenges. With the typical Yukon "if you're going to go for it, you might as well go for the top" attitude, Dawson organizers wrote to Ottawa challenging the World Champions to a Stanley Cup duel. The challenge was accepted.

The Klondike team sallied forth from Dawson to do battle with the Ottawa Invincibles, also known as "The Silver Seven." Ottawa Hockey Team Won First Game of Series by Score of 9-2. The Dawson Hockey team went down in overwhelming defeat before the Ottawa Invincibles by a score of 23-2 in the second.

Telephone Service

The next public improvement to be inaugurated in White Horse will be a telephone system. Already the wires have been strung, the switch boards placed in working order and the receiving instruments will be installed next week. The work now being done is of a private nature, but when completed will in all probability be absorbed and become a part of the Yukon Electrical company.

The system being put in is what is known as the Strowger Automatic Telephone, one of the latest and most up-to-date known, by the use of which absolute secrecy is guaranteed to every patron of the line.

Each telephone has an automatic sliding dial, by turning which so that the figures on the dial correspond to a plate beneath the sender can be automatically connected with any other instrument on the circuit which he may desire. Should the line be in use, connection cannot be made, a knowledge

of this being conveyed to the one wishing to use the same by a slight buzzing sound.

The Strowger Automatic telephone does away with a receiver at the central office. While a message is being sent the central office is disconnected the same as other phones on the circuit, and there is no danger whatever of any communication which you wish to make being conveyed to disinterested parties.

The Strowger Automatic telephone is rapidly replacing companies in the east where central telephone operators are employed, and there is now being formed in Chicago a company with \$5,000,000 capital to put in the system in that city.

The rules for the telephone will at the commencement be \$10 per month for business houses and \$5 per month for residences.
